

- All horse exhibitors must complete the following mandatory requirements to participate in the
 Jefferson County Fair attend one Horse Etiquette/Safety session and two ride events per year. All 4H horse members must also complete the Equistep Program at
 https://cfaesosu.catalog.instructure.com/courses/equistep-2023. Please contact Debbie Hukill at
 740-632-3169 or Debbie Grimes at 740-424-4996 with any questions.
- There will be no Jr Fair or Sr Fair Llama/Alpaca shows. If a Jr Fair exhibitor has a Llama/Alpaca project we will do an exhibition if they wish to show their animal.
- Any classes not having at least three (3) entries will only receive place ribbons.
- Livestock sale order Lambs, Hogs, Feeders, Steers, Poultry, Rabbits, Goats
- Changes have been made to 7th Dept and 8th Dept classes. Please refer to the 2023 fair book for changes.
- All market poultry will be weighed. Turkeys will be weighed on the scale at the livestock arena at 9:00 am on Monday.
- Belgium Hare breed has been added to rabbits.
- Pricing changes for 2023:
 - Gate Admission, which includes rides and entertainment \$15.00
 - Season Passes, no rides included \$50.00 for six (6) admissions
 - Ride bands for an additional \$5.00
- The camping fee for 2024 will increase to \$250.00. Camping wristbands will remain \$30.00
- All Jr Fair participants including still project and cloverbuds will receive wristbands that will include rides.
- An ID form and pictures must be submitted for all animals entered in Jr Fair. See form for due dates and photo requirements.
- There will be no Mudd Boggs this year.





JEFFERSON COUNTY FAIR - CODE OF CONDUCT

Anyone attending events either as an exhibitor, advisor, volunteer, parent, spectator, superintendent, judge, committee member or fair official must conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the Code of Conduct and according to the Rules and Regulations of the Jefferson County Agricultural Society, dba Jefferson County Fair. These codes of conduct and rules are not limited to the show ring, but are applicable to any event held at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds including, but not limited to meetings, workshops, clinics, contests, shows, county fair, etc. Consequences to violating this code of conduct may include, but are not limited to:

- . Verbal warning
- . Written warning
- . Removal from Fairgrounds
- . Suspension, reduction and/or loss of premiums
- . Suspension, reduction and/or loss of auction proceeds
- . Loss of future show privileges
- . Loss of privilege to be on Fairgrounds property

The act of making an entry in the fair, participating, and/or attending such events on the Jefferson County Fairgrounds is giving verification that you will abide by the code of conduct and understand the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code.

Exhibitors, Advisors, Volunteers, Parents, Family Members, Spectators, Superintendents, Judges, Committee Members, and Fair Officials Expectations:

- Be responsible for your own behavior/conduct; uphold high standards for the group and accept consequences for Inappropriate behavior
- . Support and abide by the rules set forth by Fair Board, Superintendents, Committees, and Clubs
- . Practice good citizenship, leadership, and self-governance
- . Follow the direction of staff
- . Demonstrate positive sportsmanship and attitudes at all times
- . Be courteous and respectful to others
- . Use appropriate language at all times
- . Respect and adhere to guidelines of the Jefferson County Fair Code of Conduct and all rules and regulations that apply to participation/competition

Behavior, Conduct, and Activities Not Permitted at events held at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds and Ohio State University Extension Activities related to the Jefferson Fair:

- . Unsportsmanlike, unethical, immoral conduct
- . Improper language, (i.e., profanity)
- . Bullying, intimidation, belittling
- . Possession or consumption of alcohol (Except at Fair Board approved events)
- . Possession or consumption of illegal drugs, including the use of tobacco by a minor.
- . Possession or use of weapons or fireworks
- . Possession or use of harmful objects with the intent to harm or intimidate others
- . Destruction of property (i.e., graffiti)
- . Violation of established curfew
- . Disrespect for adults, other participants, volunteers, staff, and or leaders of the event
- . Postings, listings, pictures that are deemed inappropriate on fairgrounds or on Social Media forums.

The Jefferson County Fair Board of Directors reserves the right to remove any persons, at their discretion, from the grounds who violates the Rules & Regulations and/or the Code of Conduct. The Jefferson County Fair Board of Directors reserve the right to amend, change or add to these rules and regulations as they, in their judgment, may deem advisable. All Jefferson County Board of Directors decisions are FINAL.







JEFFERSON COUNTY FAIR GENERAL CAMPING RULES

- 1. No camper is to be set up before Wednesday without contacting the fairboard office. Campground electric and water will be on Wednesday before the fair to the Monday morning after the fair. (NO OPEN FIRES DURING THAT TIME.)
- 2. No bicycles, ATVs, 4-wheelers, dirt bikes, go carts, golf carts, scooters, skate boards, roller blades, or other wheeled rides are allowed on the fair grounds after Tuesday, prior to the week of the fair. Violators will be removed from the fairgrounds.
- 3. Campers must fit in the space or you will be transferred to another space at the direction of the fairboard. All camping lots & electrical outlets are assigned by the fairboard.
- 4. All fire lanes must be kept open at all times.
- 5. No pets allowed in camping area except service dogs. Any violators will be given that day to remove the pet. If non-compliant, the camper must leave the general camping.
- 6. Quiet hours begin at 12:00 midnight for all of fairgrounds. This will be enforced! Violators will be escorted from fairgrounds.
- 7. Generators are to be shut off at 12 midnight. Tampering with electrical service will result in removal from the grounds.
- 8. All trash is to be placed in proper containers.
- 9. No sewer permitted to be discharged on the grounds.
- 10. No outside refrigerator units.
- 11. Electrical cord used on campers must be number 10 wire campers must have 30 amp RV plug.
- 12. Picnic tables are not to be taken by campers from the shelter houses.
- 13. There will be no parking of any vehicles within 50 ft. of any buildings.
- 14. It is strongly recommended that you have a fire extinguisher in your camper at all times.
- 15. Each water hookup and camper must have a backflow valve on it. This is a state mandate. No exceptions.
- 16. You must call the fairboard office if you are not bringing your camper in by Friday before the fair.
- 17. Please pick up your camping permit in the fair office on the date and time listed on back of book.
- 18. Deposits of \$50 can be made during office hours at the fair or mailed to PO Box 2315, Wintersville, OH 43453. You must have your reservation made by October 1st of current year or you will forfeit a camping spot. Total balance due by July 10. Annual cost is \$250.
- 19.In order to be put on the camping waiting list a \$50 deposit must be made.
- 20. All campers must wear a wristband. All campers will receive 1 camping parking sticker & can purchase 1 additional camping parking sticker. Parking in campground only. Violates driving and parking elsewhere will be removed from the fairgrounds with all premiums forfeited and refused re-admission.

Jefferson County Junior Fair Independent Livestock Youth Exhibitor Rules

An Independent Livestock Youth Exhibitor is eligible to participate in any Jr. Fair activity, a youth must be a resident of Jefferson County or, be attending any school in Jefferson County, or belong to a youth organization/group in Jefferson County. Youth must be age 8-19 as of January 1st of the current year. Independent Livestock projects can not be repeated if shown 4H, FFA, etc. in any one year.

It is the responsibility of the Independent Livestock Youth Exhibitor to:

- 1.Market Animal Entries must find out when and where tag-ins will be held and to bring any information and/or animals required to the scheduled tag-in to be so identified.
- 2.Market Animal Entries must participate in the Ohio Department of Agriculture (ODA) mandated Quality Assurance Training during 2023, to be completed according to state requirements before I can participate in the Jefferson County Fair. Because the training is provided by The OSU Extension, I also understand that it is my responsibility to contact the Jefferson County OSU Extension office (phone: 740-264-2212; website: jefferson.osu.edu) to find out when and where the training will be held.
- 3.Market Animal Entries must submit a completed Drug Notification Form online for each market animal prior to weigh-in on Monday of the fair to the appropriate staff, as mandated by ODA.
- 4.All participants (market and non-market) must acquire a 2023 Jefferson County Fair Book for the current year and submit an entry for any animal(s) using the appropriate form in the book. Entries will be due by the due date designated in the current Fair Book.
- 5.All participants (market and non-market) must follow rules and regulations as expected of all Junior Fair exhibitors as they are written in the fair book.
- 6.All Independent Livestock Exhibitor Projects must be declared by June 1st or as project requires.

Jefferson County Junior Fair Board Constitution and By Laws Available at the Jr. Fair Office during posted office hours.

Jr. Fair General Regulations

(Chairman: Dick Rine. Junior Fair Committee Members are: Debbie Hukill, Rick Shell, Tom Valuska, Ray Hilderbrand, Bob Bailey, Jeff Wood, Jr., Bonnie Randolph, and Gail Rine)

- 1. To tag exhibit and be eligible to participate in any Jr. Fair activity, a youth must be a 4-H Member, FFA Member, an Independent, or belong to a youth organization/group in Jefferson County. Youth must be age 8-19 as of January 1st of the current year.
- 2. All exhibitors who will be showing market animals must attend (with parent if 1st year project) one session on Quality Assurance given by The Ohio State University Extension Office. Failure to attend one of these meetings will result in a letter of reprimand from the Jefferson County Agricultural Society. The reprimand will include loss of privilege to show and sell the animal at the current fair. Drug forms are due 10:00 am 2:00 pm on Monday, week of fair. If forms are not turned in, exhibitors will be instructed to take animals home and will not be permitted to show or sell their animals.
- 3. No entry fees will be charged for any Junior Fair exhibitions.
- 4. All Junior Fair entries must be sent to Jefferson Co. Agricultural Society, Box 2315, Wintersville, OH, 43953 on or before July 10.
- 5. All livestock exhibitors must be placed by 12:00 noon on Monday. Weigh-in starts at 9:00 am Monday. Still Project Exhibit Hall will be open for exhibit set-up from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm on Saturday and 12:00 pm to 5:30 pm on Sunday. All booths must be completed and still projects in place by 11:00 am on Monday before fair.
- 6. During the fair, the exhibit hall will be open from 9:00 am until 6:00 pm daily or otherwise posted.
- 7. Junior Fair exhibits will be released as follows: Junior Fair Market Animals After sale; Non-Market Livestock Sunday 4:00 pm, All booth exhibits Sunday 4:00 pm. Exhibits removed before this release time shall forfeit all awards, unless written approval is officially given by the Junior Fair Committee of the Sr. Fair Board.
- 8. Every effort will be made to protect exhibits from loss or injury. However, neither the management of the Jefferson County Fair nor the Department of the Junior Fair will be responsible for loss or injuries involving exhibits.
- 9. If sufficient money is not allocated for the full amount of the premiums, all junior fair premiums will be paid on a pro-rata share.
- All exhibitors (ages 8-19 years old) exhibiting in the Junior Fair division will receive a fair wristband and all cloverbuds participating will receive a
 wristband.
- 11. In order to protest a class of the Junior Fair, the following guidelines and procedures will be followed:
 - a. The protest must be submitted in writing to a Senior Fair Board member in charge of the Junior Fair within 24 hours of action being protested.
 - b. The written protest must be accompanied by a \$50 deposit before any further action is taken. If protester is correct, the \$50 deposit will be returned. If protester is ruled incorrect, the \$50 deposit becomes property of the Jefferson County Agricultural Society.
 - c. Decisions on protests will be decided by a majority of Senior Fair Board members in charge of the Junior Fair
- 12. Junior Fair participants and parents will follow code of conduct (see pg. 14) or will be dismissed from the fair and forfeit all premiums.
- 13. All Junior Fair exhibitors who have won an award are to write and sign the "Thank You" provided with the trophy and returned in a stamped envelope to the Junior Fair office before the last day of the fair. Stamps will be available for purchase at the Junior Fair Office. Completed and stamped Thank You cards can be left in the mail basket at the Junior Fair Office.
- 14. Director/Chairperson of Sr. Fairboard Dept. is in charge of corresponding Jr. Fair show.
 - Example: Such as all communication with Judges, directions to ringmen and Jr. Fair personnel.
- 15. Animals that destroy a stall/pen the owner will be responsible for all costs to repair.
- 16. All animals must remain in their designated livestock areas. No animals permitted in camping areas, midway, office & display Buildings area, or the Lake area at any time from the Tuesday before Fair until the Tuesday after Fair.
- 17. Barn Prep (including painting) done by Jr. Fair participants must be finished by Friday, August 5.
- 18. Admission to the hog barn will be by wristband only for weigh-in, show day and the livestock sale. Each hog exhibitor will receive one wristband for themselves. Two additional wristbands will be given to each family.
- 19 Admission to the small animal barn will be by wristband only for check-in and show day. Each exhibitor will receive one wristband for themselves and one additional wristband.
- 20. No aerosol cans are to be left in the open in hog barn or can will be confiscated.
- 21. Goat barn pens will be utilized for goats only, no tack, feed, equipment, or personal items will be permitted in goat pens. No exceptions. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of premiums.
- 22. No identifying tags or marks on animals or exhibitors will be permitted in any Jr. Fair Classes. This means no farm tags, special show harnesses or marked show shirts are allowed. Exhibitor will be directed to remove the advertisement. Failure to comply will result in expulsion from all Jr. livestock shows and sale.
- 23. Classes not having at least three entries will only receive ribbons.

Jefferson County Jr. Fair King and Queen

Any male or female, single (never married) Not pregnant, never been pregnant, not adoptive parent of any child, ages 16-19 years of age (as of January 1st, current year) who is also an active member of any youth organization participating in the Jefferson County Fair or an individual competing as an Independent is eligible to compete. No sexting, drug, or alcohol convictions or charges pending.

Other than minor or petty offenses, the candidate must never have been convicted of any criminal offense and have no criminal charges pending against them.

Queen & King applicants must have completed 3 consecutive years of membership in a youth organization that participates in Jefferson County Fair.

Contestants must fill out an application/autobiographical form. Interviews will be announced. Your application/autobiographical form will be due by July 10, 7:00 pm at Fair Board office. **No Forms Can or Will Be Accepted After This Date!** All entries must be complete including all required signatures or applicant cannot compete. Please arrive by 5:30pm for group pictures.

See coordinator for special rules for 2024 Ohio Fairs Queen contest.

Interview scoring will be based on activities, leadership qualifications, achievements, poise, appearance, presentation and personality. Finalists will be selected by the judges after all interviews have been completed.

The court will be announced, of no more than four (4) girls and four (4) boys on the day of judging. The court will be given instructions as to the Coronation Ceremony. The King and Queen will be crowned on Monday during the Opening Ceremonies.

Decisions are made based on completed application and the personal interview. No other support materials will be considered.

Royalty and Court Responsibilities include:

- Queen contestants are expected to wear evening gowns for the coronation and the parade and the King contestants are expected to wear dress slacks and sport coats for same. (No jeans or hats will be permitted.)
- Wearing sashes/rosettes at all times, except when showing your livestock project.
- Working the livestock shows
- · Handing out awards at livestock show
- Working Jr. Fair shows (unless you are involved in a specific show.) The Court and King/Queen will work with the Jr. Fair Coordinator to divide responsibilities
 of all Jr. Fair Shows.
- Riding in the parade
- The parade will take place on Saturday at 10:00 am. Line up at 9:00 am. You will need to work with the Jr. Fair Coordinator to secure transportation and signage
 for the parade.
- The crowns will be provided for the King and Queen.
- The King and Queen may be asked to make several public appearances throughout upcoming year to represent the Jefferson County Fair
- The 2023 Queen may have the opportunity to represent the Jefferson County Fair at the 2024 Ohio Fair Queen Contest sponsored by the Ohio Fair Managers
 Association. The contest is held at the Ohio Fair Managers Convention.

Jefferson County Jr. Fair Prince and Princess

Any male or female, single (never married) Not pregnant, never been pregnant, not adoptive parent of any child, ages 11-15 years of age (as of January 1st, current year) who is also an active member of any youth organization participating in the Jefferson County Fair is eligible to compete.

Other than minor or petty offenses, the candidate must never have been convicted of any criminal offense and have no criminal charges pending against them. No sexting, drug, or alcohol convictions or charges pending.

Contestants must fill out an application/autobiographical form. The completed forms will be due by July 10, 7:00 pm at Fair Board Office. **No Forms Can or Will Be Accepted After This Date!** All entry must be complete including all required signatures or applicant cannot compete. Interviews will be announced. Prince and Princess will be identified immediately following the interviews. No court will be selected.

Decisions are made based on completed application and the personal interview. No other support materials will be considered.

Prince and Princess Responsibilities:

- Participate in the Coronation Ceremonies on Monday.
- Princess is expected to wear a party dress (below the knee or longer)
- Prince is expected to wear dress slacks or khaki's and dress shirt (no jeans or hats)
- · Wear sash at all times unless competing in an event at the fair
- Be available for pictures with champions as needed at the Livestock Sale on Saturday
- Ride in the parade
- The parade takes place at 10:00 am on Saturday of fair week
- Work with the Jr. Fair Coordinator regarding additional appearances and responsibilities during and after the fair.

Special Livestock Rules

Junior Fair Exhibitors must follow open class health regulations for their respective species. Regulations can be found in rules 901:1-18-01 to 1-18-011 listed in this booklet. They must follow rule 901:19-11 dealing with humane treatment of livestock. The secretary's office will have the most up to date version of these rules. The official fair veterinarian will inspect animals on the day of unloading and daily thereafter. The official veterinarian has the right to make final decisions on animal health issues. No animal can be released from the fair for health reasons without a written statement from the official fair veterinarian.

The exhibitors have the responsibility to follow current livestock fair exhibition and tampering rules as defined by the state. These rules can be obtained from the secretary's office or the official fair veterinarian. Rules for exhibition include but are not limited to the following examples: tampering and/or misrepresentation as to breed, age, or owner – any artificial changing of natural conformation (excluding de-horning and normal grooming procedures) and/or color, such as dyes, filling under the skin, cutting ties, adding hair, or surgical removing of skin. The preceding examples will be considered fraud and deception. At the fair board's discretion, any exhibitor's animal determined to have committed such fraud can be removed from the show and not permitted to sell. Also included in the exhibition rules are animal welfare and end product use violations that include but are not limited to the following examples: drenching, shaving of pigs hair to less than ½ inch, oiling pigs, withholding food or water to "tighten up" animals after weigh-in, placing icepacks or ice water on animals before showing, and use of behavior altering drugs either natural or man made. Violations of welfare and end use regulations can result in removal from the show and not being allowed to sell at the discretion of the fair board.

If anyone suspects or has knowledge of such violations, before, during or after the show, it must be brought to the attention of a fair board member. A ruling committee of the Jr. Fair Committee, chairperson of the species involved and representative of the youth organization involved will be immediately notified and a ruling regarding the removal of the animal will be made. If the Jr. Fair committee decides to act on this complaint, a representative of this committee must contact the head advisor or parent of the offender. At no time are they to approach, confront, or harass a junior fair exhibitor. (see rules 901:5-14)

All animals must be placed in their assigned stalls or will be asked to leave the fairgrounds. Stall assignment forms must be completed by organization or parent leaders and turned in by July 10. No feed will be provided.

All market projects are terminal - No exception. All Grand & Reserve hog, steer, goat and lamb champions will go to a packer designated by the Fair Board to be slaughtered. All animals not making minimum or maximum weight must go home on Monday by 4:00 pm.

All Grand and Reserve Champions, except feeder calves, in the Jr. Fair livestock sale shall go to the packer designated by the Fair Board prior to the sale. At registration, all buyers shall sign and agree to this rule. After the livestock sale, all Grand and Reserve champions shall go to a Fair Board designated area for load out. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE. Any buyer or exhibitor demonstrating compliance with this rule will be banned from participating in the Jefferson County Fair for the following year.

Animals must be shown by the Jr. Fair exhibitor that registered the project or in accordance with the exhibitor's winning plan. Please note hardship cases are not any of the following: college, sports, school or extracurricular activities, vacation. Any hardship cases must be approved by the Jr. Fair Department involved. In the event of 2 market projects in the same class, another Jefferson County Jr. Fair exhibitor in good standing can show the animal. Exceptions will be made according to project & exhibitor's accommodations approved by Sr. Fair Board. Also known as winning 4-H Plan.

Members must be able to show and control their animal. No exception will be made for another Jr. Fair member to show because the animal cannot be shown or controlled by the original exhibitor. Final decisions of safety to show will be the responsibility of the Department in charge. If deemed unsafe to show, animal must be removed from

All exhibits must be part of the member's project. An animal cannot be exhibited under more than one exhibitors name. Lambs, goats, hogs, feeder calves, and dairy beef feeders showing at the fair will be tagged the first Saturday in May. Ear tag number must be visible from the back of the animal. Steers, Market Heifers, and Dairy Beef Steers will be tagged the third Saturday in November. All steers must have a halter on & be able to lead. No exceptions. Poultry and rabbit registration/tag-in will be last Saturday in July. This includes open class.

No electronic communication devices are to be used by Jr. Fair Exhibitors while competing in any animal show at Jefferson County Fair. Exception for medical or physical handicap. Must notify Jr. Fair Committee of use.

Any substitutions will only be approved if showing in the original class entered.

Possessions of animals: Animals must be cared for by the youth member after a project is weighed-in, tagged in, or registered as a project. Animals must be stalled at the exhibitors residence (as defined by school registration or driver's license). Any other location, must be submitted in writing to the Jefferson County Jr. Fair Committee prior to start of project for approval by the committee. During the project year, if circumstances require a change in location and/or possession, the same written permission must be submitted and approved. The Stalling location must be within a 30 mile radius of the exhibitor's residence for consideration. Failure to comply with the possession rule will result in the exhibitor being suspended from participating on any level in the Jefferson County Fair for 1 year. Fair board reserves the right to verify said possessions.

Jr. Fair grooming can only be done by exhibitor, exhibitor's immediate family (defined as parents, grandparents, and siblings), advisor from exhibitor's club and/or exhibitor's organizational leader (FFA, etc.) Violators will not show or sell (in accordance with OSF rules).

All market animals, where applicable, will be weighed in to determine weight classes. Request for a second weigh-in must take place before the animal leaves the scale from the first weigh in. All junior fair livestock pens and stall must be cleaned and manure removed to designated areas by 12 Noon each day of the fair and upon leaving

Junior Fair exhibitors may weigh in and tag 3 market projects, but show, and sell a maximum of 2 market units with a maximum of two from any one market livestock category. Exception being poultry and rabbits (12) due to high mortality rates. Third animal tag must be turned in at weigh-in on Monday of fair in order to participate in fair. Categories are: steers, dairy beef feeder, hogs, lambs and goats. Exhibitors may sell only 2 pens of 3 market rabbits, 2 pens of 3 market chickens (3 fryers), 2 pens of market ducks (2 ducks), 2 market geese, or 2 market turkey. No more than 2 market pens can be sold. Feeder calves and dairy beef feeders which will be sold are considered a market project. If selling, exhibitor must list for sale the night of the feeder calf show or calf will not be sold. Any terminated steer projects must be reported to the sale committee before spring tag-in, in order to be eligible for additional market tag-ins.

Market animals will be divided into classes and/or divisions at the discretion of the fairboard.

Drug notification forms - Must submit a completed drug notification form online for each market animal prior to weigh-in or exhibitor will be unable to participate.

All sheep will have a scrapie tag in their ear. Goats will have scrapie tag unless registered, non-market, then can have active micro-chip.

Violation of any Jr. Fair rules will result in the loss of premium money. Animals shown in breeding classes may not be shown in market classes and vice versa.

No feeding of animals in trailers is allowed.

All animals, except draft horses, must be in place by noon on Monday if you are stalling all week. This includes Jr. Fair and Sr. Fair (open class).

Showmanship Contest

The following species will hold showmanship classes: poultry, sheep, horse, rabbit, swine, goats, beef, dairy, dogs, llamas and pygmy goats. Purpose: The purpose of a showmanship contest is to encourage young exhibitors to acquire skill and knowledge in handling of livestock and to obtain information and practice in "fitting and grooming" them for show. Check species sections for individual showmanship rules for grooming.

- All Jr. Fair livestock exhibitors are urged to participate in the following classes:
 - Junior showmanship 8-11 years of age.
 - b. Intermediate showmanship 12-14 years of age.
 - Senior showmanship 15-19 years of age.
 - Supreme showmanship- is open to all current year's first place showmanship winners from Junior, Intermediate and Senior. Previous class winner will remain in supreme class only until changing age group. Upon age change, exhibitors will immediately return to appropriate age class. (Example - junior showmanship winner will show in supreme class until reaching intermediate age class. That individual must win intermediate showmanship to re-enter supreme.) Note: Previous winner of age class may not show in that age class again. Age is of January 1 of current year.
- Premiums will be awarded as follows for the above showmanship contests provided that there are three entries in the class. If not, bottom monies will be given in accord with the number entered.

Showmanship includes appearance of the exhibitor, equipment used to show the animal, and ability to properly move and pose the animal. **Super Showmanship**

Sign up is required by Friday at Noon at the Jr. Fair office. No late entries will be accepted. Dogs and Dairy Supreme Winners must register immediately after their shows. Current year winner of each of the following species Supreme Showmanship class will be eligible to participate in the Super Showmanship Class: Poultry, Dairy, Goats, Sheep, Pygmy Goats, Horses, Beef, Rabbits, Swine, and Dogs.

If supreme showman declines, second place showman may participate, etc. to 5th place. Horse Contestant – current year winner of Supreme Showmanship, Sr. Class No. 21.

Scoring will be done by independent judges for each species, placing participants 1st through 5th. There will be a class for each species. The winner of each species in Supreme Showmanship is responsible to provide adequate animals for each participant to show in Super Showmanship, i.e. 8 steers, 8 hogs, etc. (Check with the Jr. Fair Office after Noon on Friday to determine the exact number of animals needed.) You must ask permission to use other exhibitor's animals. Check with your 4-H Advisor and/or the Fair Board Member in charge of that department for assistance.

The recording of scores will be done by assigned Jr. Fair Board members that are not involved in this event.

An exhibitor will not participate in the species class that they represent, i.e. the Beef Supreme Showman will not compete for points in the beef class of the Super Showmanship contest.

- All animals shown in Jr. Fair livestock's market classes, except feeder calves and dairy beef feeders, are terminal and may not be bought back or scratched from the sale. Failure to comply with these conditions will result in a suspension of one year from all Jr. Fair market livestock classes
- 4. Jr. Fair Exhibitors must declare by 2:00 pm on Monday if feeder calves and/or dairy beef feeders will be sold in the livestock sale.
- 5. Market animals will be released after sale. Jr. Fair exhibitors will be responsible for market animals until loaded on the trailer.
- 6. All steers must be accompanied by a halter which will be given to the buyer or cost of halter will be deducted from their sale check.7. All animals will sell only once. Money will not be released to exhibitors until the buyers have paid in full.
- 8. A nominal fee will be charged to the buyer of poultry projects for transportation and butchering
- Livestock left after 9:00 pm on Sunday, will be the sole responsibility of the buyer. Jefferson County Agricultural Society and Sale Committee are not responsible for any market animals.
- 10. All checks issued by fairboard and sale committee are void past 90 days.

Weights

- A market hog must weigh 200-320 lbs. to sell
- A market lamb must weigh 75-160 lbs. to sell
- A feeder calf must weigh 300-700 lbs. to sell
- A steer must weigh at least 800 lbs. to sell
- A market goat must weigh at least 50 lbs. to sell
- A rabbit meat pen must consist of three rabbits with each rabbit weighing between 3.5 and 6 pounds (pen weight 10.5-18 lbs.)
- Each individual market duck must weigh 5-10 lbs. to sell
- Each individual meat chicken must weigh 5-10 lbs. to sell.
- Each market turkey must weigh 20-40 lbs. to sell.
- Each market goose must weigh 10-15 lbs. to sell.

Ages

- All meat ducks must be hatched week of June 18, 2023 or later.
- All meat geese must be hatched week of May 21, 2023 or later.
- All market turkeys must be hatched week of April 9, 2023 or later.
- All market chickens must be hatched week of June 25, 2023 or later.
- 11. Any self-haul agrees that all animals are terminal.
- 12. Admission to the hog barn will be wristband only for weigh-in, show day and the livestock sale. Each hog exhibitor will receive one wristband for themselves. Two additional wristbands will be given to each family.
- 13. Only Grand and Reserve Champions will be brought to the sale ring for the livestock sale. All others should submit pictures to bonjoran70@gmail.com

All market animals will be sold through the Jr. Fair Sale. The Jefferson County Fair Board can refuse to permit the sale of any animal not meritorious. Two (2) percent of gross sales will be deducted for sale expenses. Beef, hog, and sheep pay small amount to state or national organizations for advertising and promotion. Beef - \$1.00 per head, Hogs - \$.25 per head, sheep – 1% of gross sale. All rabbits and poultry sold must be accompanied by a pen transport unless otherwise provided by sale committee. Payment is expected in full within 7 days of sale or a \$100 penalty will be added per animal.

- 2. All poultry must be free of infectious diseases and parasites.
- 3. All meat projects must follow hatchery date guidelines Located in livestock sale guideline.
- 4. All birds must be owned by the exhibitor.
- 5. Limit of 5 entries total of poultry. (5 cages) (Market entries are included in this number). One (1) entry per cage.
- 6. All animals in market classes will be placed.
- 7. All exhibitors will be required to give 1 hour of barn duty time during the fair week for the safety of the animals housed in the Rabbit/Poultry building. Failure to do so will result in the forfeiture of premiums and awards. Jr. Fair participants are required to attend cage cleaning the Saturday following fair. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of premiums and awards.
- 8. All poultry must be brought to tag-in the last Saturday in July. Pollorum testing will be done that day. This includes open class.
- 9. All exhibitors are encouraged to order extra poultry in case of a loss of one or more animals. No poultry shall be purchased from another person or exhibitor to replace the loss of their own flock. A total of 9 birds per market project can be tagged.
- 10. All animals housed in the rabbit and poultry barn must leave the building no earlier than 4:00 pm and no later than 6:00 pm on Sunday, the last day of the fair, market animals may leave follwing the conclusion of the Junior Fair Livestock Auction and release by sale committee. All caged areas will be cleaned when removing animals on Sunday.
 - A. Market Poultry- General Rules for all market projects
 - a. All meat pens of poultry will sell at the sale unless there should be a loss of one or more animals of the original market pen once it is checked in during the fair, then the remaining pen of poultry will be disqualified for the sale even though they have been judged. The remaining animals of market pens will be sent to the Carrolton Livestock Auction and will not be permitted to be taken home.

- b. Should any market animal expire during the fair after the sale, the exhibitor shall forfeit the sale money.
- c. All exhibitors must clean under cages before 9:00 am, and before leaving Sunday or premium will be forfeited.
- d. The following is the description of Jr. Fair Market Poultry projects; there is no open class market poultry (Sr. Fair).
 - Market Chickens
 - A. Can show & sell 2 pens.
 - 1. All Market Chickens must be hatched on or after the week of June 25, 2023.(6 weeks prior to fair). No exceptions.
 - 2. Meat pen of chickens shall consist of 3 chickens.
 - 3. Each individual chicken must weigh between the minimum of 5 lbs. and the maximum of 10 lbs. Consistency between birds is stressed. A parent or club advisor must be present at weigh-in for any exhibitor under 18 years of age.
 - 4. At the discretion of the small animal committee chicken entries may be divided in weight classes for judging purposes.

II. Market Turkey

- A. Can show & sell 2 pens.
 - 1. All turkeys must be hatched on or after the week of April 9, 2023.(18 weeks prior to fair). No exceptions.
 - 2. Meat pen of turkeys shall consist of one male or female turkey per pen.
 - 3. Turkeys may be of any market breed.
 - 4. The individual turkey must weigh between the minimum of 20 lbs. and the maximum of 40 lbs. A parent or club advisor must be present at weigh-in for any exhibitor under 18 years of age.
 - 5. At the discretion of the small animal committee the turkeys may be divided in weight classes for judging purposes.

III. Market Ducks

- A. Can show & sell 2 pens.
 - 1. All ducks must be hatched on or after the week of June 18, 2023.(8 weeks prior to fair). No exceptions
 - 2. Market Pens will consist of two ducks being of the same sex.
 - 3. Ducks may be of any market breed.
 - 4. Each individual duck must weigh between the minimum of 5 lbs. and the maximum of 10 lbs. A parent or club advisor must be present at weigh-in for any exhibitor under 18 years of age.
 - 5. At the discretion of the small animal committee the ducks may be divided in weight classes for judging purposes.

IV. Market Geese

- A. Can show & sell 2 pens.
 - 1. All geese are to be hatched on or after the week of May 21, 2023.(12 weeks prior to fair). No exceptions.
 - 2. Market Pens will consist of one goose, male or female.
 - 3. Market goose may be of any market breed.
 - 4. Market goose must weigh between the minimum of 10 lbs. and the maximum of 15 lbs. A parent or club advisor must be present at weigh-in for any exhibitor under 18 years of age.
 - 5. At the discretion of the small animals committee the geese may be divided in weight classes for judging purposes.
- f. All exhibitors of market pens shall provide a non returnable cage for transportation to processor or auction.
- B. Layer Poultry
 - 1. Layer pen consists of one female chicken, duck, turkey or goose.
- C. Fancy Poultry
 - 1. Fancy pen consists of either sex of chicken, duck, turkey, guinea or goose.
 - 2. A pen consists of 1 animal.
- 11. All Grand and Reserve market animals must be sent to the packer for processing in accordance with state law. No animal is permitted in the barn until it is checked in by a Sr. Fair Small Animal Committee Member.
- 12. Animals are to be handled by the owner or their designee only.
- 13. Violation of any rules will result in expulsion from the fair.
- 14. All poultry must have a USDA form 9-2 from hatchery or a USDA 9-3 for chickens can be obtained at tag-in the last Saturday of July.
- 15. No hay & straw in pens.
- 16. No changes will be made to show bill after it is printed.
- 17. Small animal barn will open 10:00 am to 6:00 pm Sunday prior to fair and Monday at 8:00 am until noon prior to fair for check-in.
- 18. All market projects must be accompanied by show number for that project.
- 19. Only Jr. Fair age persons may enter show ring to assist exhibitor.
- 20. No changes to entries after tag-in.
- 21. All Junior Fair poultry exhibitors must enter a showmanship class and show an animal from one of their Junior Fair poultry projects. Filure to do so my result in suspension from showing.
- 22. Any request for rule exemption must be made in writing to Sr. Fair Small Animal Committee by morning of species show. Request must be signed by exhibitor and parent or club head advisor.
- 23. Admission to the small barn will be by wristband only on show day. Each exhibitor will receive one wristband for themselves and one additional wristband.



Department J-VI Jefferson County Fair

- 1. Identification of the exhibitor's animal must be made to the Sr. Fair Horse Committee by June 1st of the current fair year. Exhibitor will list place animal is kept, if not at the same residence. See Possession Rule under Special Livestock Rules.
- 2. All Animals shown by an exhibitor must be owned by the exhibitor or in partnership with his or her immediate family, or can be leased. An animal may be shown by only one exhibitor during the Junior Fair.
- 3. All new pony exhibits and borderline measurement cases are subject to measurement by Sr. Fair Horse Committee.
- 4. Coggins test and health certificate are not required, unless animal has been housed outside of Ohio.
- 5. * Uniform Rules for 4-H Horse Show Rules, at the discretion of the Sr Fair Horse Committee, shall be the judging guidelines for all classes.
- 6. Each exhibitor is responsible for the following; obtaining his/her own bedding, keeping the barn area clean, cleaning up after their horse, no items in barn protruding over 48 in., no hay or bedding stored in barn, and no riding in the barns, no horse on midway at any time ,no riding of horse on roadways, or in camping area, , no riding or leading horses on the asphalt, except to cross, and no painting of horses hooves on asphalt.
- 7. Horse and pony exhibits will be exercised in approved areas with possible schedule developed by the Senior Fair Horse Committee. Animals will be exercised in walk, trot, and cantor only, except during designated times. Riding of horses prior to class will be permitted in the area of the gate. No running of horses anytime outside of the ring .Free lunging in practice ring only prior to 7 am.
- 8. At midnight the ring will be closed to everyone—all animals must be in their stalls at that time. Only persons with the direction of a vet, knowledge of their group leader or parents shall have an animal out and moving on the grounds. Notification must also be made to the Senior Fair Horse Committee.
- 9. All animals must be led and walked from the barns and tents to the show ring and exercise ring at all times.
- 10. A tie rope shall have a snap when it is attached to a halter.
- 11. Clubs could be assigned time to work the ring gate.
- 12. Exhibitors must participate in Showmanship in order to participate in any other classes.
- 13. Exhibitors will choose which discipline they will compete in for showmanship class-Western or English-not both.
- 14. No English attire in Western classes and no Western attire in English.
- 15. Last year's Supreme Showmanship winners and present year class winners may show in Supreme Showmanship. If present year winner declines to show, 2nd place can show. Supreme showmanship winners must stay in supreme unless they change age class. All others return to their age class after showing in supreme one year.
- 16. Each class will be placed 1 through 5 and receive ribbons.
- 17. Over 25 entries per class or number selected by Senior Fair Horse Committee, shall be broken into an odd or even group. After the groups are judged, the top 5 from each group will show for final placing.
- 18. No one under 19 is permitted to show a stallion over 1 year old.
- 19. Any exhibitor with a draft horse project may show one additional animal for horsemanship classes only. Any youth exhibiting a hitch project must use their hitch project as their showmanship horse. They may bring a second animal for horsemanship classes, as long as stall space is available.
- 20. Animals with a body condition score of less than 4 or obviously sick will be sent home under the direction of the Senior Fair Horse Committee.
- 21. There will be positively no mistreatment of horses tolerated.
- 22. All participants at the fair will display good sportsmanship and conduct at all times.
- 23. Electronic communication equipment is not allowed that will allow someone to be in communication with the exhibitor while they are participating in their class. Exceptions based on medical hardship can be approved by Committee
- 24. Exhibitor showing contest halter class must show in class 51-64. If not, they will forfeit contest halter premium.
- 25. All youth age 19 and under riding at the Jefferson County Fair grounds are required to wear and secure a properly fitted ASTM/SIE certified helmet with a fastened chinstrap.
- 26. Any infraction of these rules will result in exhibitor being requested to leave the fair immediately and forfeit all premiums and awards.
- 27. The Jefferson County Fair Board reserves the right to amend, change or add to these rules and regulations as they, in their judgment, deem advisable. All Board decisions are final.
- 28. All horse exhibitors must complete the following mandatory requirements to participate in the Jefferson County Fair attend one (1) Horse Etiquette/Safety session and two (2) ride events per year which will be evaluated by appointed judges. All 4-H horse members must also complete the Equistep Program @ https://cfaesosu.catalog.instructure.com/courses/equistep-2023. - 1. Time of Judging Wednesday, 9:00 am, beginning with Showmanship fryers, doe and litter, and by breed classes. All meat rabbits must be weighed in on Monday, at 10:00 am 12:00 noon.
- 2. Junior classes will consist of rabbits between the ages of three months (on or before August 1) through eight months. Senior classes will consist of rabbits the ages of nine months or older.
- 3. Exhibitors must be present while rabbits are being judged unless excused by the Sr. Fair Small Animal Committee.
- 4. Exhibitors may show two breed rabbits or one doe and litter or two meat pens of three or any combination of these, not to exceed 5 pens per exhibitor (including those registered as open class).
- 5. Diseased rabbits will not be permitted on the fairgrounds. Refer all suspected diseased rabbits to a veterinarian.
- 6. All Jr. Fair rabbit exhibitors must enter a showmanship class and show a rabbit from one of the classes mentioned in rule #4. Failure to do so may result in suspension from showing.
- 7. Each class will be placed 1 through 5
- 8. All pet and market rabbits, except doe and litter, must be tattooed. ID forms for pet rabbits and doe and litter must be received by the Jefferson County Extension Office by June 1, of the current year. If tattooed after June 1st, tattoo number must be called into the Jefferson County Extension Office to be added to the previously turned in ID form. All rabbits must be brought to tag-in the last Saturday in July. This includes open classes. ID forms for market rabbits must be completed and turned in that day. Any pet and market rabbits that have not been previously tattooed will be tattooed that day. All ID forms must include the tattoo number.
- 9. All animals housed in the rabbit and poultry barn must leave the building no earlier than 4:00 pm and no later than 6:00 pm on Sunday, except the market animals and they can leave following the conclusion of the Junior Livestock auction and release by sale committee. All caged areas will be cleaned when removing animals on Sunday.
- 10. Market rabbits must be in possession of the exhibitor by last Saturday in July.
- 11. Be on time for showing. Once a class has been shown, there will be no make up of any classes if you missed your class.
- 12. All animals being housed in the rabbit and poultry barn must be inspected by one of the members of the small animals committee before being put into the assigned cages for any diseases.
- 13. No hay or straw will be permitted in the pens at anytime unless it is approved by a small animal committee members present at the fair.
- 14. All exhibitors will be required to give one hour of barn duty time during the fair for the safety of the animals housed in the rabbit and poultry barn. Failure to give this time will result in the forfeiture of premiums and awards. Jr. Fair participants required to attend cage cleaning Saturday following fair failure to do so will result in forfeiture of premiums & awards.
- 15. All exhibitors must clean under cages daily before 9:00 am and before leaving Sunday, or premiums are forfeited.
- 16. Should any market animal expire during the fair after the sale the exhibitor shall forfeit the sale money.
- 17. All exhibitors are encouraged to tag in one extra pet rabbit, and one extra for market pen in case there is a loss of one of their project rabbits.
- 18. Each exhibitor must bring their own securable water and feed dishes.
- 19. Animals are to be handled by the owner or their designee.
- 20. Breeding of animals on the fairgrounds is prohibited.
- 21. Violation of any rules will result in expulsion from the fair.
- 22. All Grand and Reserve Champion market animals must be sent to the packer for processing in accordance to state law.
- 23. The Sr. Fair small animal committee will base cage assignments on the exhibitors height and age. No animals will be placed in a cage until the assignments have been completed. No exhibitor can exchange a cage assignment without prior approval of the Sr. Fair small animal committee.
- 24. All entries must be in the correct classes. No changes will be made to the show bills after it is printed.
- 25. Small animal barn will be open for check-in Sunday 10:00 am to 6:00 pm and Monday 8:00 am to Noon prior to fair.
- 26. Admission to the small animal barn will be by wristband only on show day. Each exhibitor will receive one wristband for themselves and one additional wristband
- 27. Any request for rule exemption must be made in writing to Sr. Fair Small Animal Committee by morning of species show. Request must be signed by exhibitor and parent or club head advisor.

Fryer - Meat Rabbit F-1

- 1. Breeds of meat type rabbits are Palomino, D'Argent, Silver Martin, Rex, Satin, Californian, New Zealand and Chinchilla. The rabbits do not necessarily have to be these breeds. They can be a mix of larger type meat rabbits. Uniformity shall be stressed.
- 2. Meat pens will consist of three rabbits all the same breed and variety.
- 3. Two or more exhibitors of the same family can use the same doe for individual pens of three fryers.
- 4. Does should be bred no sooner than the first week of May.
- 5. Fryers are to be a minimum of 9 weeks in age, and maximum 11 weeks of age at fair time. Each fryer must weigh 3.5 to 6 lbs.6. All pens of fryer rabbits will sell in the sale unless any one or more of the rabbits in the pen of three weighs more or less than the maximum and minimum weight, or the total pen weight of 10.5-18 pounds.
- 7. Exhibitors may sell two pens of three rabbits. Not to exceed 2 mkt. projects.
- 8. Should there be a loss of one or more rabbits of the market pen of three before or during the fair, remaining pen of rabbits will be disqualified from being judged and sold at the sale. The remaining animals of market pens will be sent to Carrolton Livestock Auction and will not be permitted to be taken home.
- Should any market animal expire during the fair after the sale the exhibitor shall forfeit the sale money.
- 10. All exhibitors of market pens shall provide a non-returnable cage for transportation to processor. No cardboard boxes will be accepted. No exceptions.
- 11. All pens must be accompanied by show number at check-in.
- 12. Only Jr. Fair age persons may enter show ring to assist exhibitor.

Rabbit Hopping -Class RH

- 1. We will be following the AHARC Nationals Rules found on the AHARC site and they will be available on request.
- A rabbit may have only one handler. Handlers and rabbits are considered a team. Persons with disabilities may appoint an animal handler for a competition
- A rabbit may complete in only one of lots 1-5, only one of lots 6-10, and lot 11 and/or lot12. Course descriptions follows.
- 4. No rabbits are allowed in the competition area until their event.
- 5. The number of runs offered will be three.
- 6. The maximum time per run will be three(3) minutes.
- All competitors must abide by the rabbit general rules.
- First infractions will result in a warning. Second infraction will result in handlers DQ from event, without refund of fees. All judge's decisions are final.
- 9. Animal entered may be any breed of domestic rabbit, no pedigree is required.
- 10. Animals must be at least 6 months of age to compete.
- 11. Pregnant does are not permitted to compete. In addition, any doe that has had a litter in the past 8 weeks is not permitted to competition.
- 12. Rabbits shall proceed through the course and over the jumps voluntarily.
- 13. H style harnesses and leashes are required for all rabbit hopping events.
- 14. No treats (for you or your rabbit) will be allowed on the hopping course or in the warm up area.

Please remember these Courses are based on the ability of the rabbit, not the handler. Rabbit may compete in a harder

course, but not an easier one if they have competed and won in that course.



OHIO'S LIVESTOCK HEALTH EXHIBITION RULES

901:1-18-01 Chapter's application.

- (A) Animals listed in this chapter when moved or imported into Ohio for exhibition purposes only shall comply with the requirements of this chapter and when in compliance with the provisions of this chapter shall, with the exception of rules governing movement and importation of quarantined animals, be exempt from any other rules governing movement within or importation into Ohio.
- (B) Animals moved within or imported into Ohio for any purpose in addition to exhibition shall meet all movement and import requirements of Chapter 901: 1-17 of the Administrative Code.

901:1-18-02 Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

- (A) "Exhibition" means any public show of animals which is sponsored by or under the control of an Ohio county or independent agricultural society organized under chapter 1711. of the revised code; or the Ohio state fair; or which is assembled for a period which exceeds thirty-six hours or contains animals of origins other than Ohio.
- (B) "Certificate of veterinary inspection" means a form from the state of origin which has been issued and completed by a licensed and accredited veterinarian attesting to the health status and identification of an animal listed thereon.
- (C) "Approved veterinarian" means any licensed and accredited veterinarian approved by the Ohio department of agriculture, or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture or the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services.
- (D) "Licensed and accredited veterinarian" means a person who is licensed by the state of Ohio to practice veterinary medicine and who is certified by the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services, to be an accredited veterinarian.
- (E) "Residue" means any poisonous or deleterious pesticide governed by 40 c.P.R. 180, any poisonous or deleterious substance governed by 21 C.P.R. 109.6, or any other substance governed by 21 C.P.R. 556.
- (F) "Contagious or infectious disease" means any disease, including any foreign animal disease, or vector, capable of transmission by any means from a carrier animal to a human or to another animal and includes dangerously contagious or infectious diseases.
- (G) "Tuberculosis accredited free herd" is one that has passed at least two consecutive annual negative official tests for tuberculosis in accordance with the "Uniform Methods and Rules Bovine Tuberculosis Eradication", and has no other evidence of bovine tuberculosis.

901:1-18-03 Exhibitions: sanitation, inspection and records.

- (A) Each entity sponsoring an exhibition shall have in attendance an approved veterinarian for the duration of the exhibit.
- (B) Each entity sponsoring an exhibition shall:
 - (1) Immediately, prior to an exhibition and under the direction of the approved veterinarian, thoroughly clean and disinfect each building, pen, stall, ring or other enclosure in which animals are to be quartered for exhibition;
 - (2) Have the approved veterinarian:
 - (a) Examine the certificate of veterinary inspection when required for an animal brought to the exhibition;
 - (b) Inspect within a reasonable time of arrival each animal brought to the exhibit for symptoms of any infectious or contagious diseases;
 - (c) Daily inspect each animal present at the exhibition for symptoms of infectious or contagious disease.
 - (3) Maintain a record for one year from the date of the exhibition of each animal present at the exhibit. The record shall contain the name and address of the owner of each animal and the species and breed of the animal.
 - (4) May order the immediate removal of any animal which in the opinion of the approved veterinarian places other animals at unacceptable risk of disease.
- (C) An exemption from the requirements of paragraph (B)(1) of this rule maybe requested from the department and will be granted when, in the judgment of the department, cleaning and disinfection will serve no purpose. By way of example only, cleaning and disinfection will generally serve no purpose in a newly constructed building that has never been occupied.

901:1-18-04 Exhibitors.

- (A) No person shall present for exhibition or exhibit an animal which he knows or has reason to suspect is affected with or has been exposed to a dangerously contagious or infectious disease or residue.
- (B) The owner or bailee of an animal with symptoms of an infectious or contagious disease shall, when directed by an exhibition official, the approved veterinarian, or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture, immediately remove the animal from the exhibition premises.
- (C) Upon request, each person who presents for exhibition or exhibits an animal, shall make available any certificate of veterinary inspection, registration certificates, vaccination certificate, and other documents to exhibition officials, the approved veterinarian or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture.
- (D) Each person who presents for exhibition or exhibits an animal for which a certificate of veterinary inspection is required by rules 901:1-18-01 to 901:1-18-11 of the Administrative Code shall forward a copy of the certificate of veterinary inspection to the Ohio department of agriculture's division of animal industry.

901:1-18-05 Poultry and fowl.

- (A) All turkeys, chickens and gamebirds moved within or imported into Ohio for exhibition must:
 - Originate directly from a flock or hatchery which is a participant in the national poultry improvement plan for the eradication of disease and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirements of this paragraph; or
 - (2) Originate directly from a flock which has had a negative test for pullorumlfowl typhoid disease within twelve months preceding the opening date of exhibition and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirement of this paragraph; or
 - (3) Have had a negative test for pullorumlfowl typhoid disease, within ninety days, preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be accompanied by documentary evidence that they meet the requirement of this paragraph; or

- (4) Be tested for pullorumlfowl typhoid disease upon arrival at the exhibition by a tester approved by the Ohio department of agriculture and found negative.
- (B) The rapid whole blood test shall not be used to test turkeys for compliance with the requirements of paragraph (A)(2),(A)(3) and (A) (4) of this rule.
- (C) Waterfowl, doves and pigeons are exempt from this rule.

901:1-18-06 Cattle.

- (A) Cattle moved within Ohio for exhibition:
 - (1) The animals presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
- (B) All cattle imported into Ohio for exhibition must:
 - (1) Be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be identified with official individual identification;
 - (2) Originate from a tuberculosis-accredited free herd, an accredited free state or zone, or a modified accredited advanced state or zone;
 - (3) If originate from a modified accredited state or zone must comply with Rule 901: 1-17 -03 of the Administrative Code;
 - (4) If originate from an accreditation preparatory or a non-accredited state or zone are prohibited from exhibition;
 - (5) If from a brucellosis class A state or area/zone must be negative to an official brucellosis test within thirty days of the opening date of the exhibition unless: they are under six months of age, steers, or official vaccinates under twenty months of age (dairy) or twenty four months of age (beef); and
 - (6) If from a brucellosis class B or C state or area/zone must meet all requirements for pre-entry testing as specified in 9 C.F.R. 78.9 and obtain an Ohio permit prior to movement.
- (C) Cattle from a brucellosis certified free herd or class free state or area/zone are not required to be brucellosis tested.

901:1-18-07 Goats.

- (A) Goats moved within Ohio for exhibition:
 - (1) The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
 - (2) All sexually intact animals and any wether eighteen months of age and older must be identified with an official identification as defined in rule 901: 1-13-04 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
- (B) Goats imported into Ohio for exhibition:
 - (1) Must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be identified with official individual identification;
 - (2) The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease; and
 - (3) The owner and the veterinarian must attest to the following statement written on the certificate of veterinary inspection "the goats in this shipment are not known to be under any movement restrictions because of scrapie."
 - (4) Originate from a tuberculosis accredited free herd as defined in rule 901-18-02 (G) of the Administrative Code for bovine tuberculosis eradication; or
 - (5) Originate from a bovine accredited free state or zone, or a bovine modified accredited advanced state or zone; or
 - (6) Originate from a bovine modified accredited state or zone must comply with Rule 901: 1-17-06 of the Administrative Code.
- (C) If originate from a bovine accreditation preparatory or a bovine non-accredited state or zone are prohibited from exhibition.

901:1-18-08 Horses, mules and ponies.

- (A) Horses, mules and ponies moved within Ohio for exhibition:
 - (1) If not under quarantine and if they are free of any signs of a contagious or infectious disease; and
 - (2) If the animal is twelve months of age or older, the exhibition manager may require that the animal has been tested and classed negative to an official test for equine infectious anemia within twelve months of the opening date of the exhibition.
- (B) Horses, mules and ponies imported into Ohio for exhibition:
 - Shall be accompanied by an official certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days of the opening date of the exhibition; and
 - (2) If the animal is twelve months of age or older, it shall be accompanied by evidence the animal was negative to an official test for equine infectious anemia within twelve months of the opening date of the exhibition; and
 - (3) Upon request by an authorized representative of the Ohio department of agriculture, the person responsible for each animal must make available a chronological list of dates, places and events attended by this animal within thirty days prior to entry into Ohio.

901:1-18-09 Sheep.

- (A) Sheep moved within Ohio for exhibition:
 - (1) The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
 - (2) All sexually intact animals and any wether eighteen months of age and older must be identified with an official identification as defined in rule 901: 1-13-04 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
- (B) Sheep imported into Ohio for exhibition:
 - (1) Must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be identified with official individual identification; and
 - (2) The animal presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease; and
 - (3) The owner and the veterinarian must attest to the following statement written on the certificate of veterinary inspection "the sheep in this shipment are not known to be under any movement restrictions because of scrapie."

901:1-18-10 Swine.

- (A) Swine moved within Ohio for exhibition:
 - (1) The animals presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
 - (2) Will be exempt from the requirement of a certificate of veterinary inspection if they originate immediately and directly from a pseudorabies stage V area.
 - (3) Swine originating from a pseudorabies stage IV area shall:
 - (a) Be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition; and
 - (b) Originate from a pseudorabies qualified herd; or
 - (c) Be negative to an official pseudorabies test within thirty days of the exhibition.
- (B) Swine imported into Ohio for exhibition:
 - (1) Must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition; and
 - (a) Originate immediately and directly from a pseudorabies stage V area or an area or country recognized by the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services as pseudorabies free; or
 - (b) Originate immediately and directly from a pseudorabies stage IV area; and
 - (c) Be negative to an official pseudorabies test within thirty days of the exhibition.

901:1-18-11 Llama.

- (A) Camelids including, but not limited to, llamas, alpacas and vicuanas moved within Ohio for exhibition when presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.
- (B) Camelids including, but not limited to, llamas, alpacas and vicuanas imported into Ohio for exhibition:
 - (1) Must be accompanied by a, certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be identified with official individual identification.
 - (2) When presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of contagious disease.

Jefferson County Agricultural Society Rules and Regulations

- The Jefferson County Fair Board of Directors reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations
 and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard there-to, or to otherwise arising out of,
 connected with or incident to the Jefferson County Fair. It further reserves the right to determine unforeseen matters not
 covered by these rules, to amend or add to these rules. In its judgment it may determine and withdraw all premium offerings
 in all departments should any emergency exist and circumstances demand it.
- 2. In the event a conflict arises between the general rules and the special rules governing the various departments, the special rules will take precedence.
- 3. It will be the duty of the superintendents to receive all animals or articles for exhibit in their departments and place them in their proper positions, to have the report properly signed by the judges and returned to the secretary directly after the judging is completed.
 - a. Admission to the fair will be \$15.00 per person. Gates will open at 8:00 am, Tuesday.
 - b. Children up to their second (2nd) birthday will be admitted free.

- c. Senior Citizens over 70 years of age shall be admitted free with proof of age. Senior citizens 70 years of age or older may enter open classes by paying entry fee only, without purchase of season ticket.
- d. Holders of season tickets are entitled to six admissions to the fair by presenting their tickets.
- e. Tuesday is "Golden Buckeye Day." All persons who possess a Golden Buckeye card will be admitted free to the fair. Saturday Veterans w/ proper IDs will be admitted for free.
- f. Camper car passes will be in the form of a window sticker. They must be placed inside the left hand side (driver's side) of the front window. Stickers must be stuck on the window, not taped on. If they are not stuck on the window, you will not be admitted through the camping gate. Stickers are only valid in camping area.
- g. Only campers can buy additional parking pass, 1 per lot. Advisors not camping can purchase one parking pass. Parking passes are good only in the camping area NOT near or around buildings, barns, on the midway, or grandstand area! Driving and parking violators will be removed from the fairgrounds and all premiums forfeited.
- h. Handicapped parking will be provided on an area near the entrance/ticket booth.
- i. There will be no parking within 50 feet of ANY building
- j. Motorcycles and similar vehicles must park in designated area on fairgrounds.
- 5. a. Membership tickets may be purchased by any resident of Jefferson County who is 18 years of age or older for \$10.00. They may be purchased from the secretary or treasurer. Tickets are available from December 15 until Saturday before Fair. The membership ticket entitles the member to vote at the election of directors.
 - b. Season tickets, at the price of \$50.00, may be purchased until Monday before Fair. The tickets will be available from the secretary's office, any director, AgPro Bloomingdale, Jefferson Landmark Bloomingdale, Cadiz & Dillonvale, McConnell's Meat Market Richmond, Murphy Tractor Toronto, Thompson's Dillonvale, Smithfield Hardware Store Smithfield, M&M Hardware Steubenville, Kenco Richmond, Super C Smithfield.
 - c. Concessionaires will receive one parking area identification sticker. They will also receive one gate pass for each 10 feet of frontage.
 - d. The Jefferson County Fair Board will not be responsible for any lost tickets.
- 6. Persons proposing to make entries will not be allowed to examine entry books.
- 7. Judges may require proof of ownership of any doubtful, disputed point and will make the award to the best animal or article. Judges in making their awards will take into consideration fitness or suitability of the animal or articles in the class in which they are entered. Premiums will be awarded whether there is much, little or no competition, provided the animal or article be deemed meritorious/no first places guaranteed, Judge's decision final.
- 8. Should a premium be found to have been obtained by false evidence or any misrepresentation or violation of any rules of the Society on the part of the exhibitor, they will forfeit all premiums awarded.
- 9. Ribbons received as premiums will be: First-blue, Second-Red, Third-White, Fourth-Yellow, Fifth-Green.
- 10. The Society agrees to pay all premiums in full, providing the receipts are sufficient to do so, after deducting the necessary expenses. In case the receipts are not sufficient, the Society reserves the right to pay the premiums pro rata. All premiums will be paid within 30 days following the fair, by mail, after inspection of pens, removal of manure, and payment is approved by the director in charge. All checks issued by fairboard and sale committee are void past 90 days.
- 11. No person will be allowed to stay on the fair grounds while intoxicated.
- 12. All rentals for concessions or other legal privileges must be paid in accordance with contract. **No** lottery of any kind will be permitted.
- 13. All necessary precautions will be taken to prevent accident or injury to livestock and other articles on exhibition but the Society will not be responsible for any accidents that may occur during the fair.
- 14. Competition for premiums open to all counties.
- 15. A well regulated police force will be in attendance during the fair to protect property, preserve order and enforce the rules of the Society.
- 16. a. The officers of the Society will be: in attendance during the fair, give information, and render any assistance

- necessary. The fairboard office will be open according to schedule on back cover.
- b. Camping and Registration Entry deadlines All must be received by July 10, 7:00 pm. No entries will be taken after this time. Entries may be mailed to: Jefferson County Agricultural Society, P.O. Box 2315, Wintersville, OH 43953 postmarked by July 10.
- Entry tags, camping permits and passes are to be picked up at the secretary's office as indicated in office hours. They will
 not be mailed.
- d. Fair week office hours: See schedule on Back Cover.
- 17. a. Golf cart use on the fair grounds will be limited to fair board members and associates.
 - b. Nobody is to be on a motorized vehicle except those on official business designated by the fair board, handicap scooter or wheelchair.
 - c. Concessionaires may use their golf carts on the midway area only and will not be permitted in the livestock area.
 - d. No unauthorized vehicle including bikes, skateboards, scooters, mopeds, 4-wheelers, dirt bikes, go carts, ATVs, rollerblades, and other wheeled rides will be allowed on fairgrounds after Tuesday prior to Fair until Tuesday after Fair. Violators will be removed from fairgrounds.
- 18. No dogs, except for certified service dogs, will be permitted on the fairgrounds. Dogs will be permitted in concession camping.
- a. No roving vendor or solicitor, acting for a profit or non-profit organization, shall be permitted on the fair grounds.

 All solicitations for contribution or sale must be made from within the confines of a booth or display unless otherwise exempted by rule 1711.12 of the administrative code of the Dept. of Agriculture, State of Ohio.
 - b. No person will be permitted to post or display signs, distribute handbills or advertising material, or sell or distribute free, any merchandise except persons under contract.
 - c. All open class participants must clean stalls to receive premiums.
- 20. Curfew: Lights will be turned off in show ring at 12:00 midnight.
 - Quiet hours begin at midnight for all of fairgrounds. This will be enforced! Violators will be escorted from fairgrounds. No unauthorized events at any time will be tolerated violators will be prosecuted.
- 21. All paging will be handled by the Sheriff's Office.
- 22. All participants in competitive events must pay admission at the gate.
- 23. Livestock buildings:
 - a. Open class barns and Jr. Fair barns will **not** be permitted to add any type of structure to the outside of barns, including tarps.
 - b. No tents, no cooking units, no refrigerator units will be permitted in the barns or plugged into barn receptacles.
- 24. One stock trailer per ten (10) animals will be permitted to park where designated adjacent to livestock barn. All other stock trailers/trucks are to be parked at the end of campground "E." All permission and stickers must be obtained from Sr. Fair Board.
- 25. Concealed Handgun HB 12-Jefferson County Fairgrounds. All structures will be posted prohibiting concealed handguns. License Holders are permitted to carry in the open areas of the fair grounds, but not into any structures. For this reason, CCW licenses may want to secure their weapon in the parking lot, if they intend to enter any structures on the fair grounds.
- 26. Membership is required to vote in election of officers.
- 27. The Board of Directors reserves the sole and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations set forth in this book and also reserves the right to rule on all questions not covered in these rules and regulations, and determine arbitrarily all matters and differences in regard thereto, from which there is no appeal.
- 28. Riding safety All horse riders 19 years of age & under must ride with a helmet at all times.
- 29. Those running for Fair Board Director must have attended 3 Fair Board meetings in current year. (Oct. 1–Sept. 30)





JEFFERSON COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY, INC. CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I - TITLE

Section 1. The society shall be known as the Jefferson County Agricultural Society, Inc.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

Section 1. The object of this society shall be to promote and encourage agriculture, industry, science, art and other interests of Jefferson County which the board deems proper and in the interests of the County.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Any resident of Jefferson County who is eighteen years of age or older may become a member of the Society by paying annually the membership fee as fixed by the board of directors.

Section 2. No person shall pay for or secure more than one such membership, and that membership shall be for himself. No membership shall be issued to corporations, firms, or organizations.

ARTICLE IV - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The management shall consist of a board of 21 members, who shall be selected for a term of three years and the terms so arranged that the terms of one-third of the members shall expire annually.

Section 2. Any vacancy caused by death, resignation, removal from office, or other causes may be filled by the board until the next annual election, when a director shall be elected for the unexpired term.

Section 3. Any Board Member removed from the Board may not be permitted to run for the Board again for 10 years.

Section 4. No person may hold a seat on the fairboard and the livestock sale committee at the same time.

Section 5. No more than 2 immediate family members will seek election or serve on the Board at the same time. Immediate family is defined as spouse, parents, grandparents, children-adopted, half and step children, grandchildren, siblings, in-laws-mother, father, brother, sister, daughter, and son.

ARTICLE V - ELECTION

Section 1. The annual election of the board of Directors shall be held at or near the secretary's office on the fairground, Thursday, the third day of the fair from 12:00 noon to 8:00 pm.

Section 2. The said election shall be by ballot. Ballots must be marked with an "X" or "✓". All stray marks or writing on Ballots will deem Ballot invalid. Ballots with more boxes marked than candidates to be elected will be deemed invalid.

Section 3. Only persons holding membership certificates on the date and hour of the election may vote.

Section 4. Members of the society must declare their candidacy for the office of director of the society by personally securing a blank petition from the secretary of the society or filing with the secretary of the society said petition signed by ten or more of the members of the society, at least seven (7) days before the annual election of directors is held. Only nominated candidates who have met the filing requirements will be eligible for election as a director. Candidates must have attended three (3) fair board meetings in

the current year (Oct. 1-Spet. 30), cannot be a convicted felon or have written a bad check to the fair board or violated board code of conduct.

Section 5. The term of office of the retiring directors shall expire and that of the directors-elect shall begin on the first day of November of each year, or as soon after that date as the successors are elected and qualified.

ARTICLE VI – ANNUAL MEETING OF THE MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The annual meeting of the members of the Society shall be held the third Tuesday of October with the place to be selected by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. At this meeting, the officers and directors of the society shall make reports to the membership of the society concerning the past fair and make recommendations for the betterment of future fairs. The members shall be given opportunity to make suggestions and recommendations for the improvement of the society and its Fair. Such other business may be presented as prescribed by the constitutions or as may be deemed proper by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII – ORGANIZATION AND MEETINGS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall meet annually by the fourth Saturday in November and elect a president, for a one year term. At this meeting a vice-president, secretary, treasurer, and concession-manager shall be elected for a term of one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.

Section 2. The president and vice-president shall be directors. The secretary and treasurer may or may not be directors.

Section 3. Before the election of officers, the newly elected directors shall qualify by taking the following oath (or affirmation) before a competent authority:

"I do solemnly swear that I will support the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of the State of Ohio, Laws of Ohio and rules and regulations of the Department of Agriculture of Ohio pertaining to agricultural societies and to the best of my ability perform the duties of Director of the Jefferson County Agricultural Society, Inc., so help me God."

ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS

Section 1. Amendments to the Constitution and by-laws may be proposed by:

- (A) A majority of the Board of Directors at a scheduled meeting voting in favor of placing an amendment on the ballot, or
- (B) Filing a petition with the secretary of the society at least 14 days prior to the annual meeting of the membership of the society.

Section 2. When one or more amendments are submitted at the same time they shall be so submitted as to enable the members to vote on each amendment separately.

Section 3. If a majority of the attending membership voting on the proposed amendment shall adopt such amendment, it shall become part of the Constitution and by-laws.

ARTICLE IX - COMPENSATION

Section 1. The compensation of the Board of Directors shall be fixed by the Board in accordance with the rules of the Ohio Department of Agriculture.

Section 2. The Board of Directors may pay the actual expenses of any Director, and any duly authorized representative of the Board for any other event that is directly beneficial of the Society.

ARTICLE X - BONDS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall fix the dates of the annual exposition of the Society, subject to the approval of the Director of Agriculture.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - QUORUM

Section 1. Meetings shall be held when necessary, at the call of president or at the call of the secretary upon request of not less than two of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Notice of the meeting of the Board of Directors shall be delivered to reach the director or sent by mail or telephone at least two days before the meeting.

ARTICLE II - ORDER OF BUSINESS

Section 1.

- 1. Roll Call
- 2. Reading and approval of minutes
- 3. Communications
- 4. Bills and accounts
- 5. Report of committees
- 6. Report of officers
- 7. Unfinished business
- 8. New business
- 9. Appointments
- 10. Adjournment

Section 2. The order of business may be suspended at any meeting upon a majority vote of all present.

ARTICLE III - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the president to preside at all meetings of the Board, to appoint committees, and to perform such other duties as may be determined by the Board.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the vice-president to assume the duties of the president in the event of his absence or vacancy of the office and to perform such duties as may be determined by the Board.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the secretary to:

- 1. Keep a list of all members of the Society.
- Keep accurately a record of all proceedings of the Society and the Board.
- 3. Notify all members of the Board of the time and place of all the meetings.
- Give the members of the Society notice of time and place of the annual meeting of the membership and the election of the Board of Directors.
- Keep strict account of all money that may come into her hands and pay the same over to the treasurer and take receipt therefore.
- Keep a correct itemized account of all receipts and expenditures of money.
- 7. Help make out the annual report to the Ohio Department of Agriculture.
- 8. Perform such other duties as determined by the Board.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to:

- 1. Receive all money and give a receipt for same as the amount and sources from which it came.
- 2. Keep an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements.
- 3. Pay such orders as may be determined by the Board.
- 4. Make out the Annual report to the Ohio Department of Agriculture.

ARTICLE IV - DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the building and grounds committee to see that the grounds are kept in a clean and neat condition, that the buildings and fences and other property are kept in proper repair, to oversee the erection of new buildings upon the grounds and other improvements, according to the direction of the Board.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the auditing committee to audit the accounts and books of the secretary and treasurer and report the results of its findings to the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Jefferson County Livestock/Sale Committee

Duties of committee: Committee is a sub-committee of the Fair Board, supporting and enforcing rules and/or decisions of the Fair Board. All changes or rules voted on by sale committee shall be referred to Fair Board for their vote to be effective. Livestock shows and sale shall be organized & manned by the committee according to the rules of the Fair Board. Fair Board shall assign a committee of directors to each species to support the work needing done.

Committee will consist of 7 members elected by votes from Fair Directors & current sale committee members at annual election. (Associate members can be added as approved by Fair Board.) Term will be rotating 3 years-petitions requiring 3 fair director signatures and filed with the fairboard office. FFA teacher is automatic. A fair board director will be chosen by fair board as a representative.

Sale committee members are entitled to free camping, parking, season passes, and ability to have a cart during the fair.

ARTICLE V - RULES

Section 1. The Board of Directors may enact such rules and regulations for conducting the business of the Society which do not conflict with the constitution and by-laws or regulations of the Department of Agriculture, or laws of the State of Ohio.

Section 2. All checks not cashed within 60 days shall be forfeited and re-entered to the account of the Society.

Section 3. Any director missing three unexcused meetings and/ or not attending at least 8 meetings during the present year Oct. 1 to Sept. 30 may be removed from the Board by a majority vote. If you cannot make the meeting for reason of illness, work or family emergency, please contact the secretary.
