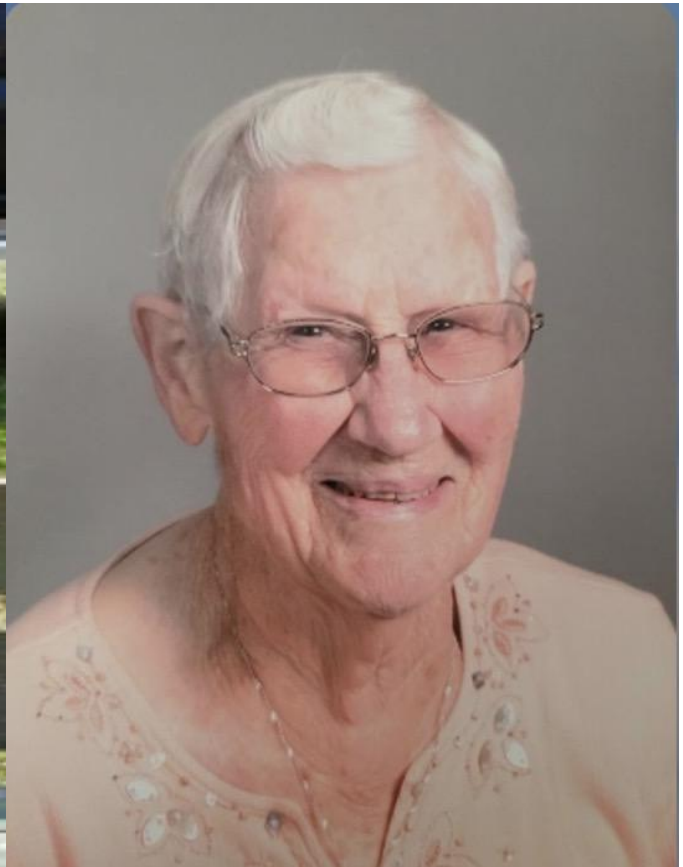

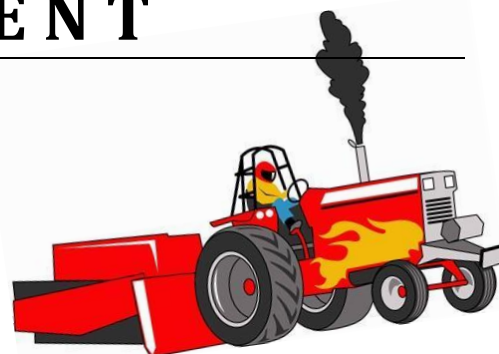

JEFFERSON COUNTY FAIR – CODE OF CONDUCT

Anyone attending events as an exhibitor, advisor, volunteer, parent, spectator, superintendent, judge, committee member, or fair official must conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the Code of Conduct and according to the Rules and Regulations of the Jefferson County Agricultural Society, dba Jefferson County Fair. These codes of conduct and rules are not limited to the show ring but apply to any event held at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds including, but not limited to meetings, workshops, clinics, contests, shows, county fair, etc. Consequences for violating the Code of Conduct may include:

- Verbal warning
- Written warning
- Removal from fairgrounds
- Suspension, reduction and/or loss of premiums
- Suspension, reduction and/or loss of auction proceeds
- Loss of future show privileges
- Loss of privilege to be on fairgrounds property

The act of making entry in the fair, participating, and/or attending such events on the Jefferson County Fairgrounds is giving verification that you will abide by the Code of Conduct and understand the consequences of penalties provided for actions prohibited by the Code of Conduct.

Exhibitors, Advisors, Volunteers, Parents, Family Members, Spectators, Superintendents, Judges, Committee Members, and Fair Officials behavior expectations:

- Be responsible for your behavior/conduct, uphold high standards, and accept consequences for inappropriate behavior
- Support and abide by the rules set forth by the Sr. Fair Board, Superintendents, Committees, and Clubs
- Practice good citizenship, leadership, and self-governance
- Follow the direction of the staff
- Demonstrate positive sportsmanship and attitudes at all times
- Be courteous and respectful to others
- Use appropriate language at all times
- Respect and adhere to the guidelines of the Jefferson County Fair Code of Conduct and all rules and regulations that apply to participating and competing in events on the grounds

Behaviors, conduct, and activities NOT PERMITTED at events held at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds, Ohio State University Extension activities, and any fair-related events:

- Unsportsmanlike, unethical, and immoral conduct
- Improper language (i.e. profanity)
- Bullying, intimidation, and belittling
- Possession or consumption of alcohol (except at Fair Board approved events)
- Possession or consumption of illegal drugs, including the use of tobacco by a minor
- Possession or use of weapons or fireworks
- Possession or use of harmful objects with the intent to harm or intimidate others
- Destruction of property (i.e. graffiti)
- Violation of established curfew
- Disrespect for adults, participants, volunteers, staff, and leaders of fair-related events
- Postings, listings, or pictures that are deemed inappropriate on the fairgrounds or on social media

The Jefferson County Fair Board of Directors reserves the right to remove any persons, at their discretion, from the grounds who violate the Rules & Regulations and/or the Code of Conduct. They also reserve the right to amend, change, or add to the Rules & Regulations at their discretion. **All Jefferson County Fair Board of Directors decisions are final.**

JEFFERSON COUNTY AG SOCIETY RULES & REGULATIONS

The Jefferson County Fair Board of Directors reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these Rules and Regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto, or to otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the Jefferson County Fair. They further reserve the right to determine unforeseen matters not covered by these rules, and to amend or add to these rules. In their judgment they may determine and withdraw all premium offerings in all departments should any emergency exist, and circumstances demand it.

1. In the event a conflict arises between the general rules and the special rules governing the various departments, the special rules will take precedence.
2. It will be the duty of the superintendents to receive all animals or articles for exhibit in their departments and place them in their proper positions, to have the report properly signed by the judges and returned to the secretary directly after the judging is completed.
3. Admission/Parking/Camping:
 - a. Admission to the fair will be \$15.00 per person. Gates will open at 8:00 am Tuesday-Sunday.
 - b. Children up to 24 months old will be admitted free.
 - c. Senior Citizens over 70 years of age will be admitted free with proof of age. These individuals may enter open classes by paying an entry fee only, without purchase of a season ticket.
 - d. Holders of season tickets are entitled to six admissions to the fair by presenting their tickets.
 - e. Tuesday - "Golden Buckeye Day." All persons who possess a Golden Buckeye card will be admitted free to the fair. Saturday - Veterans with proper IDs will be admitted for free.
 - f. Camper parking passes will be in the form of a window sticker. They must be placed on the driver's side of the front window. Stickers must be stuck on the window, not taped on. If they are not stuck on the window, you will not be admitted through the camping gate. Stickers are only valid in camping area.
 - g. Advisors not camping can purchase one parking pass. Parking passes are good only in the camping area NOT near or around buildings, barns, on the midway, or grandstand area! Driving and parking violators will be removed from the fairgrounds and all premiums forfeited.
 - h. Camping and Entry deadlines – All must be received by **July 10, 8:00 pm**. No entries will be taken after this time. Entries may be mailed to: Jefferson County Agricultural Society, P.O. Box 2315, Wintersville, OH 43953 postmarked no later than July 10.
 - i. Handicapped parking will be provided on an area near the entrance/ticket booth.
 - j. There will be no parking within 50 feet of ANY building.
 - k. Motorcycles and similar vehicles must park in designated area on fairgrounds.
 - l. Membership tickets may be purchased by any resident of Jefferson County who is 18 years of age or older for \$10.00. They may be purchased from the secretary or treasurer. Tickets are available from December 15 – until Saturday before Fair. The membership ticket entitles the member to vote at the election of directors. NOT FOR ADMISSION AT FAIR.
 - m. Season tickets, at the price of \$50.00, may be purchased until Monday before Fair. The tickets will be available from the secretary's office, any director, AgPro – Bloomingdale, Jefferson Landmark – Bloomingdale, Cadiz, & Dillonvale, McConnell's Meat Market – Richmond, –M&M Hardware – Steubenville, Kenco – Richmond, Super C – Smithfield.
4. Persons proposing to make entries will not be allowed to examine entry books.
5. Judges may require proof of ownership of any doubtful, disputed point and will make the decisions to the best animal or article. Judges in making their awards will take into consideration fitness or suitability of the animal or articles in the class in which they are entered. Premiums will be awarded whether there is much, little, or no competition, provided the animal or article be deemed meritorious/no first places guaranteed, Judge's decision is final.
6. Should a premium be found to have been obtained by false evidence or any misrepresentation or violation of any rules of the Society on the part of the exhibitor, they will forfeit all premiums awarded.
7. Ribbons received as premiums will be: First-blue, Second-Red, Third-White, Fourth-Yellow, Fifth-Green.
8. The Society agrees to pay all premiums in full, providing the receipts are sufficient to do so, after deducting the necessary expenses. In case the receipts are not sufficient, the Society reserves the right to pay the premiums pro rata. All premiums will be paid within 30 days following the fair, by mail, after inspection of pens, removal of manure, and payment is approved by the director in charge. All checks issued by the fair board and sale committee are void past 90 days.
9. No person will be allowed to stay on the fairgrounds while intoxicated.
10. All rentals for concessions or other legal privileges must be paid in accordance with contract. No lottery of any kind will be permitted.
11. All necessary precautions will be taken to prevent accident or injury to livestock and other articles on exhibition, but the Society will not be responsible for any accidents that may occur during the fair.
12. Competition for premiums open to all counties.
13. A well-regulated police force will be in attendance during the fair to protect property, preserve order, and enforce the rules of the Society.
14. Sr. Fair / Open class entry tags, camping permits, and passes are to be picked up at the secretary's office as indicated in office hours. **They will not be mailed.** Sr. Fair Board office hours can be found on page 3.
15. Golf cart use on the fairgrounds will be limited to fair board members and associates.
16. Nobody is to be on a motorized vehicle except those on official business designated by the fair board, handicap scooter, or wheelchair.
17. Concessionaires may use their golf carts on the midway area only and will not be permitted in the livestock area.
18. No unauthorized vehicle including bikes, skateboards, scooters, mopeds, 4-wheelers, dirt bikes, go carts, ATVs, rollerblades, and other wheeled rides will be allowed on fairgrounds after Tuesday prior to the fair until Tuesday after the fair. Violators will be removed from fairgrounds.
19. **NO DOGS**, except for certified service dogs, will be permitted on the fairgrounds. Dogs will be permitted in concession camping.
20. No roving vendor or solicitor, acting for a profit or non-profit

organization, shall be permitted on the fairgrounds. All solicitations for contribution or sale must be made from within the confines of a booth or display unless otherwise exempted by rule 1711.12 of the administrative code of the Ohio Department of Agriculture.

21. No person will be permitted to post or display signs, distribute handbills, advertising material, or sell or distribute any merchandise except persons under contract.
22. All open class participants must clean stalls to receive premiums.
23. Curfew: Lights will be turned off in show ring at 12:00 midnight. Quiet hours begin at midnight for all of the fairgrounds. This will be enforced! Violators will be escorted from fairgrounds. No unauthorized events at any time will be tolerated - violators will be prosecuted.
24. All paging will be handled by the Sheriff's Office.
25. All participants in competitive events must pay admission at the gate.
26. Livestock buildings:
 - a. Open class barns and Jr. Fair barns will **not** be permitted to add any type of structure to the outside of barns, including tarps.
 - b. **No tents, no cooking units, no refrigerator units will be permitted in the barns or plugged into barn receptacles.**
27. One stock trailer per ten (10) animals will be permitted to park where designated adjacent to livestock barn. All other stock trailers/trucks are to be parked at the end of campground "E." All permission and stickers must be obtained from Sr. Fair Board.
28. Concealed Handgun HB 12-Jefferson County Fairgrounds. All structures will be posted prohibiting concealed handguns. License Holders are permitted to carry in the open areas of the fairgrounds, **but not into any structures.** For this reason, CCW licenses may want to secure their weapon in the parking lot, if they intend to enter any structures on the fairgrounds.
29. The Board of Directors reserves the sole and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations set forth in this book and also reserves the right to rule on all questions not covered in these rules and regulations and determine arbitrarily all matters and differences in regard thereto, from which there is no appeal.
30. Riding safety - All horse riders 19 years of age & under must ride with a helmet at all times.
31. Those running for Fair Board Director must have attended 3 Fair Board meetings in current year. (Oct. 1-Sept. 30)
32. **Extra parking passes will no longer be available for purchase by anyone!** Fair parking passes will be limited to 2 per household. (If your household has already received a parking pass through Jr. Fair and camping, you will not receive a parking pass for Sr. Fair / Open class – **PARKING PASSES ARE 2 PER HOUSEHOLD MAX, NO MATTER WHAT YOUR HOUSEHOLD IS COMPETING IN AT THE FAIR**). Pass must be stuck to the window, and if a car is found without a pass it will be towed. Fair Board has the right to request the pass to be returned if any project is not brought to the fair.
33. All exhibitors must follow Ohio's Health, Tampering, and Youth Livestock Exhibition Rules found at: <https://agri.ohio.gov/divisions/animal-health/Livestock+Exhibitions>. All rules can be found under "Exhibition Laws and Rules" near the bottom of the page. Rules are also available upon request at the Sr. Fair Office. **ALL RULES LISTED ON THE STATE SITE WILL BE ENFORCED.**
34. No fitting is allowed at or near stock trailers. All fitting must be done within 20 feet of respective barn.

35. All animals will be dismissed on Sunday (last day of fair) starting at 12:00 pm. (NO EARLIER!)

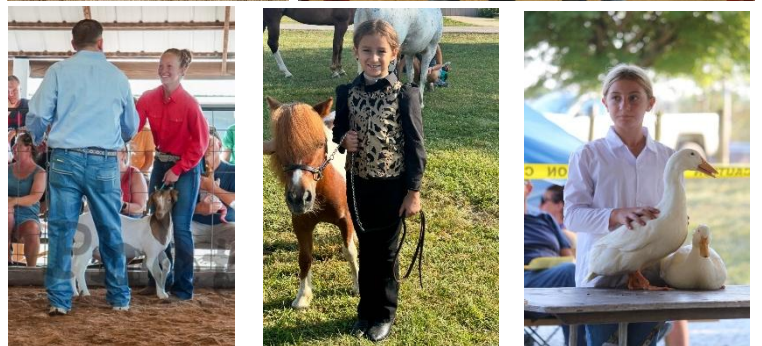

**JEFFERSON COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY,
INC. CONSTITUTION**

ARTICLE I – TITLE

Section 1. The society shall be known as the Jefferson County Agricultural Society, Inc.

ARTICLE II – OBJECT

Section 1. The object of this society shall be to promote and encourage agriculture, industry, science, art and other interests of Jefferson County which the board deems proper and in the interests of the County.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Any resident of Jefferson County who is eighteen years of age or older may become a member of the Society by paying annually the membership fee as fixed by the board of directors.

Section 2. No person shall pay for or secure more than one such membership, and that membership shall be for himself. No membership shall be issued to corporations, firms, or organizations.

ARTICLE IV – BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The management shall consist of a board of 21 members, who shall be selected for a term of three years and the terms so arranged that the terms of one-third of the members shall expire annually.

Section 2. Any vacancy caused by death, resignation, removal from office, or other causes may be filled by the board until the next annual election, when a director shall be elected for the un- expired term.

Section 3. Any Board Member removed from the Board may not be permitted to run for the Board again for 10 years.

Section 4. No person may hold a seat on the fair board and the livestock sale committee at the same time.

Section 5. No more than 2 immediate family members will seek election or serve on the Board at the same time. Immediate family is defined as spouse, parents, grandparents, children-adopted, half and stepchildren, grandchildren, siblings, in-laws-mother, father, brother, sister, daughter, and son.

ARTICLE V – ELECTION

Section 1. The annual election of the board of Directors shall be held at or near the secretary's office on the fairground, Thursday, the third day of the fair from 12:00 noon to 8:00 pm.

Section 2. The said election shall be by ballot. Ballots must be marked with an "X" or "ti". All stray marks or writing on Ballots will deem Ballot invalid. Ballots with more boxes marked than candidates to be elected will be deemed invalid.

Section 3. Only persons holding membership certificates on the date and hour of the election may vote.

Section 4. Members of the society must declare their candidacy for the office of director of the society by personally securing a blank petition from the secretary of the society or filing with the secretary of the society said petition signed by ten or more of the members of the society, at least seven (7) days before the annual election of directors is held. Only nominated candidates who have met the filing requirements will be eligible for election as a director. Candidates must have attended three (3) fair board meetings in

the current year (Oct. 1-Spet. 30), cannot be a convicted felon or have written a bad check to the fair board or violated board code of conduct.

Section 5. The term of office of the retiring directors shall expire and that of the directors-elect shall begin on the first day of November of each year, or as soon after that date as the successors are elected and qualified.

**ARTICLE VI – ANNUAL MEETING
OF THE MEMBERSHIP**

Section 1. The annual meeting of the members of the Society shall be held the third Tuesday of October with the place to be selected by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. At this meeting, the officers and directors of the society shall make reports to the membership of the society concerning the past fair and make recommendations for the betterment of future fairs. The members shall be given opportunity to make suggestions and recommendations for the improvement of the society and its Fair. Such other business may be presented as prescribed by the constitutions or as may be deemed proper by the Board of Directors.

**ARTICLE VII – ORGANIZATION
AND MEETINGS**

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall meet annually by the fourth Saturday in November and elect a president, for a one year term. At this meeting a vice-president, secretary, treasurer, and concession-manager shall be elected for a term of one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.

Section 2. The president and vice-president shall be directors. The secretary and treasurer may or may not be directors.

Section 3. Before the election of officers, the newly elected directors shall qualify by taking the following oath (or affirmation) before a competent authority:

"I do solemnly swear that I will support the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of the State of Ohio, Laws of Ohio and rules and regulations of the Department of Agriculture of Ohio pertaining to agricultural societies and to the best of my ability perform the duties of Director of the Jefferson County Agricultural Society, Inc., so help me God."

ARTICLE VIII – AMENDMENTS

Section 1. Amendments to the Constitution and by-laws may be proposed by:

- A. A majority of the Board of Directors at a scheduled meeting voting in favor of placing an amendment on the ballot, or
- B. Filing a petition with the secretary of the society at least 14 days prior to the annual meeting of the membership of the society.

Section 2. When one or more amendments are submitted at the same time they shall be so submitted as to enable the members to vote on each amendment separately.

Section 3. If a majority of the attending membership voting on the proposed amendment shall adopt such amendment, it shall be- come part of the Constitution and by-laws.

ARTICLE IX – COMPENSATION

Section 1. The compensation of the Board of Directors shall be fixed by the Board in accordance with the rules of the Ohio Department of Agriculture.

Section 2. The Board of Directors may pay the actual expenses of any Director, and any duly authorized representative of the Board for any other event that is directly beneficial of the Society.

ARTICLE X – BONDS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall fix the dates of the annual exposition of the Society, subject to the approval of the Director of Agriculture.

BY-LAWS ARTICLE I – QUORUM

Section 1. Meetings shall be held when necessary, at the call of president or at the call of the secretary upon request of not less than two of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Notice of the meeting of the Board of Directors shall be delivered to reach the director or sent by mail or telephone at least two days before the meeting.

ARTICLE II – ORDER OF BUSINESS

Section 1.

1. Roll Call
2. Reading and approval of minutes
3. Communications
4. Bills and accounts
5. Report of committees
6. Report of officers
7. Unfinished business
8. New business
9. Appointments
10. Adjournment

Section 2. The order of business may be suspended at any meeting upon a majority vote of all present.

ARTICLE III – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the president to preside at all meetings of the Board, to appoint committees, and to perform such other duties as may be determined by the Board.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the vice-president to assume the duties of the president in the event of his absence or vacancy of the office and to perform such duties as may be determined by the Board.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the secretary to:

1. Keep a list of all members of the Society.
2. Keep accurately a record of all proceedings of the Society and the Board.
3. Notify all members of the Board of the time and place of all the meetings.
4. Give the members of the Society notice of time and place of the annual meeting of the membership and the election of the Board of Directors.
5. Keep strict account of all money that may come into her hands and pay the same over to the treasurer and take receipt therefore.
6. Keep a correct itemized account of all receipts and expenditures of money.
7. Help make out the annual report to the Ohio Department of Agriculture.

8. Perform such other duties as determined by the Board.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to:

1. Receive all money and give a receipt for same as the amount and sources from which it came.
2. Keep an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements.
3. Pay such orders as may be determined by the Board.
4. Make out the Annual report to the Ohio Department of Agriculture.

ARTICLE IV – DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the building and grounds committee to see that the grounds are kept in a clean and neat condition, that the buildings and fences and other property are kept in proper repair, to oversee the erection of new buildings upon the grounds and other improvements, according to the direction of the Board.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the auditing committee to audit the accounts and books of the secretary and treasurer and report the results of its findings to the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Jefferson County Livestock/Sale Committee

Duties of committee: Committee is a sub-committee of the Fair Board, supporting and enforcing rules and/or decisions of the Fair Board. All changes or rules voted on by sale committee shall be referred to Fair Board for their vote to be effective. Livestock shows and sale shall be organized & manned by the committee according to the rules of the Fair Board. Fair Board shall assign a committee of directors to each species to support the work needing done.

Committee will consist of 7 members elected by votes from Fair Directors & current sale committee members at annual election. (Associate members can be added as approved by Fair Board.) Term will be rotating 3 years-petitions requiring 3 fair director signatures and filed with the fair board office. FFA teacher is automatic. A fair board director will be chosen by fair board as a representative.

Sale committee members are entitled to free camping, parking, season passes, and ability to have a cart during the fair.

ARTICLE V – RULES

Section 1. The Board of Directors may enact such rules and regulations for conducting the business of the Society which do not conflict with the constitution and by-laws or regulations of the Department of Agriculture, or laws of the State of Ohio.

Section 2. All checks not cashed within 60 days shall be forfeited and re-entered to the account of the Society.

Section 3. Any director missing three unexcused meetings and/ or not attending at least 8 meetings during the present year Oct. 1 to Sept. 30 may be removed from the Board by a majority vote. If you cannot make the meeting for reason of illness, work or family emergency, please contact the secretary.

Membership tickets will be on sale starting December 15 from Debbie Hukill, Treasurer. Sales concludes Saturday before fair.

JEFFERSON COUNTY FAIR CAMPING RULES

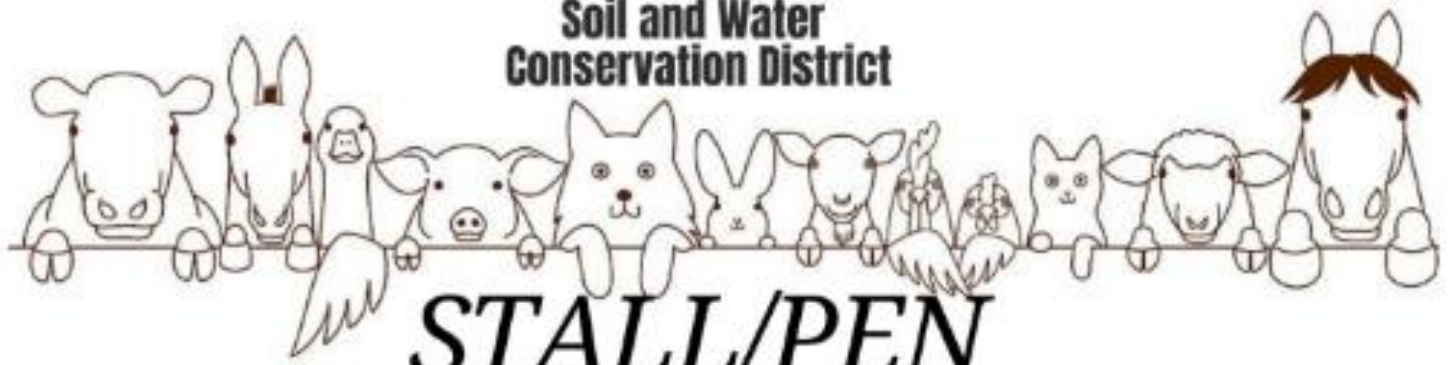
1. No camper is to be set up before Wednesday without contacting the fair board office. Campground electric and water will be on Wednesday before the fair to the Monday morning after the fair. **(NO OPEN FIRES DURING THAT TIME).**
2. **No bicycles, ATVs, 4-wheelers, dirt bikes, go carts, golf carts, scooters, skateboards, roller blades, or other wheeled rides are allowed on the fairgrounds after Tuesday, prior to the week of the fair. Violators will be removed from the fairgrounds**
3. Campers must fit in the space, or you will be transferred to another space at the direction of the fair board. All camping lots & electrical outlets are assigned by the fair board.
4. All fire lanes must be kept open at all times.
5. No pets allowed in camping area except service dogs. Any violators will be given that day to remove the pet. If non-compliant, the camper must leave the general camping.
6. Quiet hours begin at 12:00 midnight for all of fairgrounds. This will be enforced! Violators will be escorted from fairgrounds.
7. Generators are to be shut off at 12 midnight. Tampering with electrical service will result in removal from the grounds.
8. All trash is to be placed in proper containers.
9. No sewer permitted to be discharged on the grounds.
10. No outside refrigerator units.
11. Electrical cord used on campers must be number 10 wire - campers must have 30 amp RV plug.
12. Picnic tables are not to be taken by campers from the shelter houses.
13. There will be no parking of any vehicles within 50 ft. of any buildings.
14. It is strongly recommended that you have a fire extinguisher in your camper at all times.
15. Each water hookup and camper must have a backflow valve on it. This is a state mandate. No exceptions.
16. You must call the fair board office if you are not bringing your camper in by Friday before the fair.
17. Please pick up your camping permit in the fair office on the date and time listed prior to fair.
18. Deposits of \$50 can be made during office hours at the fair or mailed to PO Box 2315, Wintersville, OH 43953. You must have your reservation made by October 1st of current year or you will forfeit a camping spot. Total balance due by July 10. Annual cost is \$250.
19. In order to be put on the camping waiting list a \$50 deposit must be made.
20. All campers must wear a wristband. All campers will receive 1 camping parking sticker. Parking in campground only. Violates driving and parking elsewhere will be removed from the fairgrounds with all premiums forfeited and refused re-admission.
21. Agree to code of conduct.

JUNIOR FAIR RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. To participate in any Jr. Fair activity, you must be a member of 4-H, FFA, an Independent Exhibitor, or belong to a youth organization of Jefferson County. Members must be aged 8-19 as of January 1 of the current year.
2. All market animal exhibitors must attend (with parent if 1st year of project) one session of Quality Assurance. Failure to attend will result in a letter of reprimand from the Jefferson County Agricultural Society stating the exhibitor is not permitted to show or sell animals at the fair.
3. **All Jr. Fair entries must be submitted to or mailed to the Jr. Fair Coordinator by July 10th. This includes Animal, Parade, Royalty Booth and Shop & Crop entries.**
4. All animals must be in place at the fair by 10:00 am Monday. Weigh-in begins Monday at 10:00 am.
5. Market animal projects will be released from the fair after the livestock sale; non-market projects will be released Sunday starting at 12:00 pm.
6. Jr. Fair Booth Exhibits must be set -up and torn-down at the designated time, found in the Jr. Fair Schedule.
7. Any exhibits or projects removed before the designated timeframe will forfeit all awards unless prior written approval is given by the Sr. Fairboard.
8. All efforts will be made to protect exhibits and projects from loss or injury. However, the Jefferson County Fair Board or the Jr. Fair Coordinator will not be responsible for any loss or injury involving exhibits or projects.
9. All exhibitors participating in the Jr. Fair will receive a fair wristband for entry to the grounds that includes rides. (4-H, FFA, Independents, Cloverbuds, Sprouts (Siblings of current Jr. Fair and Cloverbuds age 2-4), etc.)
10. To protest a class of the Jr. Fair, the protest must be submitted in writing to the Sr. Fair Board within 24 hours of the action that is being protested. Protest must be accompanied by a \$50 deposit, which will be returned if the individual submitting the protest is correct. Decisions on protests will be made by the Jr. Fair Committee.
11. Jr. Fair participants, parents, guardians, siblings, etc., will all follow the Code of Conduct or will be dismissed from the fair and forfeit all premiums and awards.
12. All exhibitors who receive an award will be required to complete and turn in the provided Thank You note to the Jr Fair Office during the designated times in order to receive their award.
13. The Sr. Fair Board Committees are in charge of their corresponding Jr. Fair show in coordination with the Jr. Fair Coordinator and Assistant Jr. Fair Coordinators.
14. If an animal damages any stall/pen, the owner is responsible for all damage costs.
15. All animals must remain in their designated area. No animals are permitted in camping areas, midway, office, display buildings, or the lake area at any time during the fair.
16. Barn preparations, including painting done by participants, 4-H clubs, FFA members, must be finished by Saturday August 8th.
17. Admission to the hog barn will be by wristband only for weigh-in, show day, and sale day. Each hog exhibitor will receive one wristband for themselves. One additional wristband will be given to each family. Fair Directors and Coordinators do not need to wear a wristband to enter.
18. Admission to the small animal barn will be by wristband only for check-in and show day. Each small animal exhibitor will receive one wristband for themselves. One additional wristband will be given to each family. Fair Directors and Coordinators do not need to wear a wristband to enter.
20. No aerosol cans are to be left in the hog barn. All will be

confiscated.

21. Goat barn pens will be utilized for goats only! No tack, feed, or personal items are permitted. NO EXCEPTIONS. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of premiums.
22. No identifying tags or marks are permitted on animals or exhibitors in the show arena.
23. **Any class not having at least 3 entries will only receive ribbons, no awards.**
24. No changes will be made to any show bill after it has been printed. The only exception is if a mistake was made by the Jr. Fair Department.
25. Each animal is required to comply with all health requirements designated in the fair book and by the State of Ohio. Any animals exhibiting signs of illness or disease will not be permitted on the fairgrounds.
26. The Jr. Fair Coordinator will divide all market animal classes by weight with input from Sr. Fairboard committee chairman as needed.
27. **ALL MARKET ANIMAL PROJECTS MUST GO TO SLAUGHTER. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
28. Be on time for showing. There will be no make-up of any classes missed.
29. Market animal exhibitors must complete the Drug Use Notification Form (DUNF) by the assigned date and time, prior to weigh-in at the fair. Contact OSU Extension for more info. (1 DUNF per animal or pen of two, three).
30. At no time is anyone permitted to harass or confront any Jr. Fair Exhibitor or Jr. Fair Board member on any issue. You must speak to the Jr. Fair Coordinator, Assistants, or Sr. Fair Board only!
31. Jr. Fair projects can only be shown at one county fair during current fair season.
32. All Jr Fair Market exhibitors will be required to complete and turn in the provided Thank You note at sale check pick up prior to receiving their check.
33. **VIOLATION OF ANY RULES STATED IN THIS FAIR BOOK WILL RESULT IN EXPULSION FROM THE FAIR.**

JEFFERSON COUNTY JUNIOR FAIR INDEPENDENT LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR RULES

1. Independent exhibitors are eligible to participate in any Jr. Fair activity. Exhibitors must be a resident of Jefferson County, be attending any school in Jefferson County, or belong to a youth organization in Jefferson County. Exhibitors must be 8-19 years as of January 1 of the current year.
2. Exhibitors must ensure all animals attend tag-in (if applicable) and submit any entry forms to be eligible to participate.
3. Market animal exhibitors must complete Quality Assurance Training during the current year to participate in the fair. Exhibitors must contact OSU Extension 740-264-2212, for Quality Assurance Training session dates.
4. Market animal exhibitors must complete the Drug Use Notification Form (DUNF) by the assigned date and time, prior to weigh-in at the fair. Contact OSU Extension for more info. (1 DUNF per animal or pen of two, three).
5. All independent exhibitors must submit an Animal ID form and entry form by the designated date posted.
6. All participants must follow all rules and regulations described in the fair book.
7. All independent exhibitors projects must be declared by April 15 and submitted to Jr. Fair Coordinator, using the Independent Exhibitor Enrollment Form. Proof of age must be submitted with the form.

ROYALTY RULES AND REQUIREMENTS

1. Any male or female, single (never married), not pregnant or ever been, not an adoptive parent of any child, who is an active member of any youth organization or independent exhibitor participating in the Jefferson County Fair.
2. No explicit messaging or social media posts, drugs, alcohol, convictions, or criminal charges pending. If made aware of any of the above, individual will be immediately removed.
3. King and Queen applicants must have completed 3 consecutive years in a youth organization participating in the fair. Prince and Princess applicants must have completed 2 consecutive years in a youth organization participating in the fair.
4. All contestants must complete an application and submit to the Jr. Fair Coordinator no later than July 10th.
6. Interview scoring will be based on activities, leadership, achievements, poise, appearance, presentation, and personality. Prince, Princess, King and Queens Court will be announced in the following days. King and Queen will be crowned at opening ceremonies on Monday of the fair.
7. All Ohio Fair Managers Association rules are applicable to county royalty.

King, Queen, and Court Responsibilities:

--Ages: 16-19 as of January 1 of current year

1. Queen contestants must wear evening gowns for coronation and the parade.
2. King contestants must wear dress slacks, sport coats, or suits for coronation and parade. Jeans or hats are not permitted.
3. Must wear sash and crown at all times while representing the Jefferson County Fair, except when showing animal projects.
4. Hand out awards at a minimum of 3 livestock shows.
5. Secure and decorate parade float/vehicle for the Grand Parade Saturday of the fair.
6. Willingness to partake in many public appearances in the following year.
7. The Queen **must** represent the fair at the Ohio Fair Managers Convention in January the following year. If you cannot commit to this event, do not submit an application.
8. Greet visiting royalty and show around fairgrounds.
9. King and Queen must be in every Champion Animal picture at the livestock sale.
10. Work with Assistant Jr. Fair Coordinator to schedule responsibilities for the fair.

Prince and Princess Responsibilities:

--Ages: 11-15 as of January 1 of current year

1. Princess must wear a party dress (below the knee or longer) for coronation and the parade.
2. Prince must wear dress slacks or khakis, dress shirt, and tie. Jeans and hats are not permitted.
3. Participate in opening ceremonies Monday of the fair.
4. Must wear sash and crown at all times while representing the Jefferson County Fair, except when showing animal projects.
5. Prince and Princess must be in every Champion Animal picture at the livestock sale.
6. Hand out awards at a minimum of 2 livestock shows.
7. Greet visiting royalty and show around fairgrounds.
8. Secure and decorate parade float/vehicle for the Grand Parade Saturday of the fair.
9. Work with Assistant Jr. Fair Coordinator to schedule responsibilities for the fair.

JUNIOR FAIR SPECIAL LIVESTOCK RULES

1. Jr. Fair exhibitors must follow Ohio's Health, Tampering, and Youth Livestock Exhibition Rules found at:

[https://agri.ohio.gov/divisions/animal-](https://agri.ohio.gov/divisions/animal-health/Livestock+Exhibitions)

health/Livestock+Exhibitions. All rules can be found under "Exhibition Laws and Rules" near the bottom of the page. ALL RULES LISTED ON THE STATE SITE WILL BE ENFORCED. Copies available in the Senior Fair Office.

2. The fair veterinarian will inspect all animals on the day of unloading and daily thereafter. The fair veterinarian has the right to make final decisions on animal health issues. No animal can be released from the fair for health reasons without a written statement from the fair veterinarian.

3. Exhibitors hold the responsibility to follow all current livestock fair exhibition rules defined by the State of Ohio. (Tampering with animals, changing of natural conformation, dying, hair building, etc.). Animal welfare rules and regulations include drenching, shaving pigs less than ½ inch, oiling pigs, withholding food and water, placing ice packs, or ice water on animals before showing, using behavior altering drugs, etc. At the Sr. Fair Board's discretion, any exhibitor that is determined to have violated this rule will be removed from showing and selling their projects at the fair. **If anyone suspects any violation to this rule, please bring immediate attention to a fair board member.**

4. All market animals that do not fall within the weight requirements must leave the fairgrounds by Monday at 4:00 pm. You will be required to sign and acknowledge an Under/Overweight form directly after leaving the scale with your animal, agreeing to this rule.

5. 4-H Winning Plan: All exhibitors wishing to exhibit using the 4-H Winning Plan must consult with the OSU Extension Office.

6. Any case where an exhibitor will not be able to show or sell their animals must be approved in writing by the Sr. Fair Board. Cases include college, sports, school, extracurricular activities, etc.

7. In the event that two of the exhibitors' animals (market or non-market) fall in the same class, another Jefferson County Jr. Fair exhibitor may enter the ring to assist. No other individuals are permitted unless approved by the Sr. Fair Board.

8. All exhibitors must be able to control their own animals (without assistance from a parent, sibling, exhibitor, any other person) at all times. No exceptions will be made, and the animal will be required to leave the fairgrounds.

9. All animals can only be exhibited under one exhibitor's name.

10. Markets Steers/Heifers must attend tag-in (3rd Saturday in November) and submit Animal ID form with required information and pictures.

11. Lambs, Hogs, Goats, and Feeder Calves will be tagged at home by the exhibitor. Animal ID forms with the required information and pictures will be submitted during tag-in (1st Saturday in May).

12. Poultry and Rabbit tag-in (Last Saturday in July). Animal ID forms and required information and pictures must be submitted.

All open class animals are required to attend. You do not need to complete an Animal ID Form for open class.

13. No electronic communication devices are to be used by exhibitors while competing at the Jefferson County Fair or other event. Exceptions for medical devices or physical handicaps must be approved by the Sr. Fair Board.

14. Animals must be cared for by the exhibitor after a project is tagged-in or registered as their project. Animals must be stalled at the exhibitor's home address. Any other location must be submitted in writing to the Jr. Fair Coordinator prior to the start of the project to be approved. During the project year, if circumstances require a change in location, the same written permission must be submitted and approved. The housing location must be within a 30 mile radius of the exhibitor home address if not located at the exhibitor's home address. Failure

to comply with this rule will result in the exhibitor being suspended from the Jefferson County Fair for 1 year.

15. Grooming of Jr. Fair animals can only be completed by the exhibitor, exhibitor's immediate family (parents, grandparents, siblings), 4-H, FFA, or youth organization advisor of the club or group they are representing.

16. All market animals will be weighed Monday of the fair. The request for a second weigh-in must be done before the animal leaves the scale on the first weigh-in.

17. All Jr. Fair livestock pens and stalls must be cleaned (manure and dirty bedding) removed no later than 10:00 am each day the animal is on the fairgrounds.

18. All Jr. Fair exhibitors are allowed to tag-in a maximum of 3 market projects but show and sell a maximum of 2. The third animal/project dangle tag be turned into the Jr. Fair Coordinator during weigh-in at the fair in order to participate. Market Steer/Heifer dangle tags must be returned prior to later tag-in dates (May, July) if you had tagged in 3 market steer/heifers to receive more market tags. **DO NOT REMOVE EID BUTTON TAGS – UNLAWFUL TO REMOVE.**

19. Any animal that is shown in a breeding class is not permitted to also be shown in a market class and vice versa.

20. No feeding of animals is permitted in trailers.

21. No fitting is allowed at or near stock trailers. All fitting must be done within 20 feet of respective barn.

SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

1. All species, except small animals (Friday) will hold showmanship classes on the day of the Jr. Fair show. Horse, rabbit, and poultry showmanship is required for all exhibitors. Failure to compete will result in not being able to participate in the remainder of the show.

2. Age brackets: Junior: 8-11; Intermediate 12-14; Senior: 15-19.

3. Showmanship includes the appearance and poise of the exhibitor, along with their ability to show and knowledge of their project.

4. Exhibitors will be able to designate if they would like to sign-up for showmanship on their entry form received from the Jr. Fair Coordinator. This will alleviate the rush of exhibitors signing up for showmanship prior to the show. Sign-ups will still be available prior to the show. You are encouraged to designate you will participate in showmanship on your entry form. You will be able to scratch at the fair if you decide you do not want to participate.

SUPREME SHOWMANSHIP:

1. The winner of the animal division of the previous year(s) remains in Supreme Showmanship and the winner of each age division of the current year is invited to compete.

2. Previous winners will move to their new age bracket when they age up. Exhibitors must win the new age division in order to return to Supreme Showmanship.

SHOWMAN OF SHOWMEN

FRIDAY – 5:00 pm

Show order: Dogs, Poultry, Rabbit, Pygmy Goats, Market Goats, Sheep, Swine, Dairy, Beef, Horse

1. The current year winner of Supreme Showmanship for all species are invited to compete. Please sign-up ASAP at the Jr. Fair Office deadline is 12:00 pm Friday.

2. **If the winner of Supreme Showmanship for any species, declines to participate, the 2nd place winner will be eligible to participate.**

3. If you are not planning to participate in Showman of Showmen, please let the Jr. Fair Coordinator know ASAP to

allow time for offering the opportunity for the following class placing.

4. Judging will be completed by the winner of each species.

5. Each participant is required to secure the appropriate number of animals and equipment for all other contestants. (Maximum of 9 animals) You do not compete in the species that you won Supreme Showmanship; you are the judge. Please ask fellow Jr. Fair exhibitors for assistance or use of animals.

6. Scoring: 1st: 5 points; 2nd: 4 points, 3rd: 3 points, 4th: 2 points, 5th: 1 point. Final scoring for all individuals will be calculated by the Jr. Fair Coordinator.

7. There will be no harassment or confrontation of any participants or Jr. Fair Board members regarding any issues with the Showman of Showmen event. You must speak to the Jr. Fair Coordinator or Assistants only! Any knowledge of this occurring (from parents, exhibitors, grandparents, etc.) will result in suspension from participating in Showman of Showmen in following years.

8. Dogs being used for the contest are permitted to arrive on the fairgrounds shortly before 5:00 pm and must leave immediately after.

LIVESTOCK SALE

SATURDAY – 12:00 pm

1. All grand and reserve champion market animals will go to a packer for slaughter that is designated by the Sr. Fair Board. At buyer registration, all buyers are required to sign and agree to this rule. Any buyer or exhibitor demonstrating noncompliance with this rule will be banned from participating in the Jefferson County Fair the following year. No exceptions.

2. Sale order: Steers, Poultry, Rabbit, Goats, Lambs, Hogs, Feeders

3. **All market animals will be sold and slaughtered and cannot be bought back**, except feeder calves and dairy beef feeders, which are optional.

4. **If an exhibitor is wishing to sell a feeder calf, you must tell the Jr. Fair Coordinator or Assistant present at weigh-in if you are planning to sell the animal.**

5. Market animals will be released after the sale through Sunday. You are responsible for caring for the animal until it leaves the fairgrounds.

6. All cattle must have a non-returnable halter for transport to the processing facility.

7. A nominal fee will be charged to the buyer of any poultry projects for transportation to the processing facility.

8. Livestock left after Sunday at 6:00 pm will be the sole responsibility of the buyer. The Jefferson County Agricultural Society is not responsible for animals listed as self-haul. All self-haul buyers must agree that animals must be slaughtered.

9. All checks issued by the Sr. Fair Board are void after 90 days.

10. Top 5 Market Animals from each species will be brought to the sale ring.

11. 2.5% of gross sales will be deducted for sale expenses. Beef, hog, and sheep pay small amount to state or national organizations for advertising and promotion. Beef: \$1.00 per head, Hogs: \$0.25 per head, Sheep: 1% of gross sale.

12. Buyer payments are required in full within 7 days of the sale. Failure to do so will result in a \$100 penalty per market project.

13. Failure to comply with any rule will result in suspension from participating in the Jr. Fair Market Animal Division for 1 year.

GRAND PARADE RULES AND REQUIREMENTS

1. Entries due by July 10th
2. Judging based on the following: originality, appearance, how well the fair theme is carried out.
3. Premiums for Jr. Fair Parade Floats only: 1st: \$100, 2nd: \$90, 3rd: \$80, 4th: \$70, 5th: \$60, 6th: \$50, 7th: \$40, 8th: \$30, 9th: \$20, 10th: \$10

JUNIOR FAIR BOOTH EXHIBITS

Set-up: Saturday 9 am - 6 pm, Sunday 12 pm – 6 pm (prior to fair)

Tear down: Sunday (last day of fair) 3 pm – 6 pm

1. All booth request forms must be turned into the Jr. Fair Coordinator by July 10th.
2. Booth sizes: 4'x8' or 4'x16'
3. \$20 prizes for the 10 most outstanding booths.
4. Booth judging will take place on Tuesday at 2:00 pm, in which the building will be closed until completed.
5. Booths must be completed by Sunday prior to the fair at 6:00 pm (other than placing in 4-H awards, which must be done directly after the ceremony). If you are found working in the booth after this date and time you will be disqualified from judging.
6. **Booth tear down is from 3:00 pm - 6:00 pm on Sunday (last day of fair). You must bring trash bags to dispose of all garbage, pull all staples from the booth - leave the booth exactly how it was found. Failure to do so will result in your club or organization not being able to complete a booth the following year.**
7. No painting or any modifications are allowed to the fair booths.

DEPARTMENT C - JUNIOR FAIR POULTRY

TUESDAY – 12:00 pm

Begin with Showmanship

1. All exhibitors must show documents proving poultry were purchased from a hatchery that participates in the NPIP, which also shows the hatch date of poultry. MUST BE PRESENTED AT TAG-IN.
2. All birds must be owned by the exhibitor.
3. EXHIBITORS MAY SHOW A MAXIMUM OF 5 CAGES. ANY COMBINATION: 2 market pens, 2 layers, 1 fancy. (Maximum of 2 market pens/projects).
4. All exhibitors will be required to give 1 hour barn duty during the fair for the safety of the animals in barn #10. All exhibitors are REQUIRED to attend cage cleaning the following Saturday after the fair. Failure to do any of the above will result in forfeit

of awards and premiums.

5. All poultry must be brought to tag-in the last Saturday in July. Pullorum testing will be completed then, including open class.
6. All exhibitors are encouraged to order extra poultry in case of a loss of one or more birds. No poultry shall be purchased from another person or exhibitor to replace lost poultry.
7. All animals housed in barn #10 must leave the building no earlier than 12:00pm and on Sunday, the last day of the fair. Market animals will leave following the conclusion of the Junior Fair Livestock Auction or by removal of the sale committee.
8. All exhibitors must clean under cages before 9:00 am, and before leaving Sunday or premium and awards will be forfeited.
9. No animal is permitted in the barn until checked in by a Sr. Fair Small Animal Committee member.
10. All animals will be handled by the exhibitor or designee only.
11. No hay or straw in pens.
12. Small animal barn will be open Sunday 10:00 am - 6:00 pm and Monday at 8:00 am - 12:00 pm prior to the fair for animal check-in.
13. Only junior fair exhibitors may enter the ring to assist the exhibitor.
14. All Junior Fair poultry exhibitors must compete in showmanship and show their Junior Fair poultry projects. Failure to do so will result in suspension from showing.
15. Admission to the small animal barn on show day will be wristband only.

Additional Market Poultry Rules:

1. All meat pens of poultry will sell at the sale unless there is a loss of one or more birds of the original market pen once it is checked-in at the fair, then the remaining pen of poultry will be disqualified from the sale even though they had been judged. The remaining animals in the market pen will be sent to the Carrollton Livestock Auction and will not be permitted to be taken home.
2. Should any market animal expire during the fair after the sale, the exhibitor shall forfeit the sale money.
3. Classes will be divided by weight classes at the discretion of the Junior Fair Coordinator.
4. A parent or club advisor must be present at weigh-in for any exhibitor under the age of 18. All poultry will weigh in Monday at the designated time.
5. All exhibitors of market pens should provide a non-returnable cage for transport to the processing facility.
6. All market animals will be sent to the packer in accordance with state law.
7. All poultry must have a USDA for 9-2 from hatchery or a USDA 9-3 for chickens at tag-in.

8. TAG-IN NUMBERS: Exhibitors can tag-in a total of 9 chickens per pen (max of 27 chickens per exhibitor if no other market projects), 6 ducks per pen (max of 18 ducks if no other market projects), 3 turkeys (max of 3 turkeys total if no other market projects, 1 per market project), and 3 geese (max of 3 geese total if no other market projects, 1 per market project). Turkeys and Geese are 3 birds total, not 3 per project/pen. **Please note these numbers only apply if the exhibitor has no other market projects tagged in, if you have other market projects tagged in, these numbers decrease to limit exhibitors to only 3 market projects.** Exhibitors are restricted to tagging in three market projects across all species. If you are tagging-in 2 market chicken projects and 1 market turkey project, you are permitted to tag 18 chickens and 1 turkey.

9. Animal ID form: Market Poultry do not need to submit pictures with an ID form (1 ID form per pen).

Market Chickens:

1. An exhibitor can show and sell 2 pens.
2. All market chickens must be hatched the week beginning of

June 29, 2026, or later. No exceptions.

3. Market pens shall consist of 3 chickens.
4. Each individual chicken must weigh between 5-10 pounds. Consistency between birds is stressed.

Market Turkey:

1. An exhibitor can show and sell two turkeys.
2. All turkeys must be hatched the week beginning of April 13, 2026, or later. No exceptions.
3. Turkeys may be of any market breed.
4. Turkeys must weigh between 20-40 pounds.

Market Ducks:

1. An exhibitor can show and sell two pens.
2. All market ducks must be hatched the week beginning of June 22, 2026, or later. No exceptions.
3. Pens must consist of two ducks of the same sex.
4. Ducks may be of any market breed.
5. Each individual duck must weigh between 5-10 pounds.

Market Goose:

1. An exhibitor can show and sell two geese.
2. All geese must be hatched the week beginning of May 25, 2026, or later. No exceptions.
3. Geese may be of any market breed.
4. Geese must weigh between 10-15 pounds.

1. Layer poultry consist of one female chicken, duck, turkey, or goose.

WEDNESDAY – 9:00 am (Class 1-43)

THURSDAY – 9:00 am (Class 44-88)

1. A horse ID form must turn in this completed form into the Extension Office no later than June 1st. The exhibitor will list the place the animal is kept, if not at the exhibitor's residence (see possession rule under Special Livestock Rules).
2. All animals shown by an exhibitor must be owned by the exhibitor or in partnership with his/her immediate family or can be leased. An animal may only be shown by one exhibitor during the Junior Fair shows.
3. All new pony exhibits and borderline measurement cases are subject to measurement the Sr. Fair Horse Committee.
4. Coggins test and health certificates are not required, unless the animal has been housed outside of Ohio.
5. Each exhibitor is responsible for the following: obtaining his/her own bedding, keeping the barn area clean, cleaning up after their animal, no items in barn protruding over 48 in., no hay or bedding stored in the barn, and no painting of hooves on the asphalt.
6. Horses are not to be rode in the barns, on roadways, in camping areas, or on the midway.
7. Horse and pony exhibits can be exercised in approved areas with a possible schedule developed by the Sr. Fair Horse Committee. Animals will be exercised in walk, trot, and cantor

only, except during designated times. Riding of horses prior to class will be permitted in the area of the gate. No running of horses, anytime outside of the ring. Free lunging can be done in the practice ring only prior to 7 am.

8. All rings will be closed at midnight - animals must be in their stalls at this time. Only persons with the direction of a vet, knowledge of their group leader or parents shall have an animal out at this time. If this is to occur, notification must be made to the Sr. Fair Horse Committee.

9. All animals must be led and walked from the barn area to the show and practice rings at all times.

10. Exhibitors must participate in showmanship in order to participate in any other classes.

11. Exhibitors can only choose one discipline for showmanship - either Western or English.

12. If a class were to have over a set number of exhibitors, the class would be split and a top 5 would be selected from each group. Those exhibitors will re-enter the ring to be placed.

13. No one under the age of 19 is permitted to show a stallion over 1 year old.

14. Any exhibitor with a draft horse project may show one additional animal for horsemanship classes only. Any youth exhibiting a hitch project must use their hitch project for showmanship. They may bring a second animal for horsemanship classes.

15. Animals with a body condition score of less than 4 or obviously sick will be sent home under the direction of the Sr. Fair Horse Committee.

16. There will be no mistreatment of horses tolerated.

17. Electronic communication equipment is not allowed that will allow someone to be in communication with the exhibitor while they are participating in their class. Exceptions based on medical hardships can be approved by the committee.

18. All youth under the age of 19 are required to securely wear a proper fitting ASTM/SIE certified helmet with a chin strap while riding on fair property.

19. Any infraction of these rules will result in the exhibitor being requested to leave the fair immediately.

20. **All horse exhibitors must complete the following mandatory requirements to participate in the Jefferson County Fair - attend one (1) Horse Etiquette/Safety session and one (1) satisfactory ride event, if taking a different horse than last year. All 4-H horse members must also complete the Equistep Program:**

Begin with Showmanship

1. All market rabbits must be weighed-in on Monday of fair from 10:00 am-12:00 pm.
2. Junior Doe/Buck classes will consist of rabbits between the ages of 3 months (on or before August 1) through 8 months. Senior Doe/Buck classes will consist of rabbits ages 9 months or older.
3. Exhibitors must be present while rabbits are being judged.
4. EXHIBITORS MAY SHOW A MAXIMUM OF 5 PENS. ANY COMBINATION: 2 market pens, 2 breeding, 1 doe & litter, etc.)(Maximum of 2 market pens).

5. All Junior Fair rabbit exhibitors must compete in showmanship and show one of their Junior Fair rabbit projects. Failure to do so will result in suspension from showing.
6. All market rabbit and pet rabbit pens must be tattooed. (Doe & litter pens do not). Any rabbits not tattooed will be done at tag-in the last Saturday of July.
7. Animal ID forms for market and pet rabbits must be brought to tag in (Last Saturday in July).
8. All rabbits must come to tag-in the last Saturday of July. ID forms for market rabbits must be completed and turned in that day.
9. All animals housed in barn #10 must leave the building no earlier than 12:00pm and no later than 6:00pm on Sunday, the last day of the fair. Market animals will leave following the conclusion of the Junior Fair Livestock Auction or by removal of the sale committee.
10. No hay or straw are permitted in cages at any time, unless approved by a Small Animal Committee member.
11. No animal is permitted in the barn until checked in by a Sr. Fair Small Animal Committee member.
12. All exhibitors will be required to give 1 hour barn duty during the fair for the safety of the animals in barn #10.
13. All exhibitors are REQUIRED to attend cage cleaning the following Saturday after the fair. Failure to do any of the above will result in forfeit of awards and premiums.
14. All exhibitors must clean under cages before 9:00 am, and before leaving Sunday or premium and awards will be forfeited.
15. Should any market animal expire during the fair after the sale, the exhibitor shall forfeit the sale money.
16. All market exhibitors are encouraged to tag-in one extra pen of rabbits in case of the loss of one of their projects.
17. All animals will be handled by the exhibitor or designee only.
18. Breeding of animals on the fairgrounds is prohibited.
19. Each exhibitor must bring their own water and feed dishes.
20. No exhibitor can change cage assignments without consulting with a member of the Small Animal Committee first.
21. Small animal barn will be open Sunday 10:00 am - 6:00 pm and Monday at 8:00 am - 12:00 pm prior to the fair for animal check-in.
22. Admission to the small animal barn on show day will be wristband only.
23. Only Junior Fair exhibitors may enter the ring to assist exhibitors.
24. All rabbit exhibitors must compete in showmanship and show one of their Jr. Fair projects. Failure to do so will result in suspension from showing.

Additional Market Rabbit Rules:

1. Breed types - Palomino, D'Argent, Silver Martin, Rex, Satin, Californian, New Zealand, and Chinchilla, etc. Any type of larger type meat rabbits.
2. Market pens will consist of 3 rabbits.
3. Does should be bred no sooner than the first week of May.
4. Fryers are to be a minimum of 9 weeks and a maximum of 11 weeks at fair.
5. All market rabbits must weigh in Monday at the designated time.
6. Each rabbit must weigh between 3.5-6 pounds.
7. All market rabbit pens will be sold in the sale unless any one of the rabbits in the pen weighs more or less than the maximum or minimum weight or the total pen weight of 10.5-18 pounds.
8. All market rabbit pens will sell at the sale unless there is a loss of one or more rabbits of the original market pen once it is checked-in at the fair, then the remaining pen will be disqualified from the sale even though they had been judged. The remaining animals in the market pen will be sent to the Carrollton Livestock Auction and will not be permitted to be

taken home.

9. All market exhibitors shall provide a non-returnable pen for transport to the processing facility. Cardboard boxes are not permitted.

10. All exhibitors are encouraged to tag 1 extra rabbit per market pen in case of loss prior to fair.

11. Animal ID form: Market Rabbits do not need to submit pictures with an ID form (1 ID form per pen).

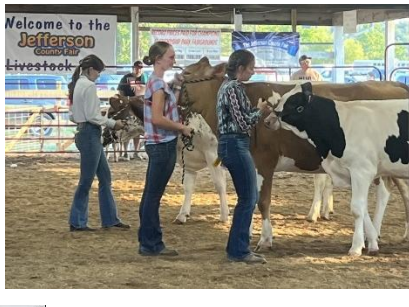
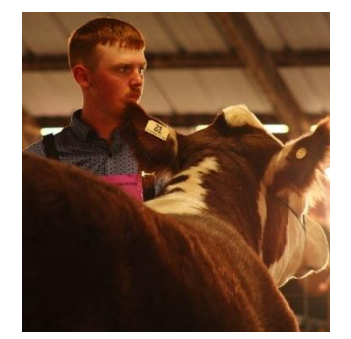
